

Who Do I Ask?

In my second job, I worked at a La-Z-Boy store. I delivered furniture to the customers who purchased it. I lived in a larger town but occasionally customers from the rural surrounding area would purchase furniture and I would be tasked with its delivery.

I will never forget going to a small town in Alabama to deliver the purchase. This was before the days of Siri, Garmin, or even MapQuest. We had to rely on the directions given to us by the customer. As I approached the town and begin to look at the directions I knew I was lost. I began to search for someone to give me assistance to find the customer's home. I would drive by a person and think "not them they are too preoccupied." I would drive by another and think "they look too scary." When I finally found the perfect person, they said, "I am sorry but I don't live here." I was looking for the perfect person to help me find my destination.

In the spiritual realm, it is also the same. Many spiritually lost people feel it is very difficult to ask a stranger for directions for life. The church is a stranger to them. Most unchurched people do not know a real Christian. They will not ask us because they do not know us. We must become a person who the lost consider safe to ask for directions.

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COURAGE

Romans 1:14–17 (ESV) I am under obligation both to Greeks and to barbarians, both to the wise and to the foolish. So I am eager to preach the gospel to you also who are in Rome. For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith for faith, as it is written, "The righteous shall live by faith."

- From these verses, who are the four-people lying by the pool?
- Does this have any parallel to our world today? How?
- Why do you believe Jesus asks the question in verse 6?
- On a scale of 1-4, with 1 being very well and 4 being not very well, rate yourself on how well prepared you are to show lost people their lostness. Write out a plan to improve.
