## Praise isn't a performance - it's about Jesus.

#### Mary's Worship (John 12:1-8)

- Mary's worship cost her something of great value (the perfume was worth a year's wages).
- You will praise the Lord in direct proportion to what you think of Him.

#### There is a danger in familiarity.

- ◊ The disciples didn't join in, instead they became spectators.
- ◊ Spectating leads to criticism.
- When we spectate, we miss the opportunity to praise. (John 4:23)

### **Praise Brings Perspective**

- ♦ Worship is TO God, for our benefit.
- It reminds us of who He is, and who we are in relation to him.
- The tipping point to victory is when you begin to praise.

### Paul & Silas (Acts 16:25-34)

- ◇ Paul and Silas are chained to the foundation of the building.
- ◊ Instead of complaining and worrying, they began to praise.
- They weren't trying to break out, God broke in!

# God's presence is manifested in praise.

- Praise is a gateway to the Presence of God
- ♦ (Isaiah 60:18, Psalm 22:3)
- ♦ Judah, means praise (Numbers 2:3)

# GO Here are 5 ways you can praise God throughout the day:

- 1. Praise Him by lifting your hands
- ♦ Lift up your hands in the sanctuary, and bless the Lord. – Psalm 134:2
- 2. Praise Him with singing
- Praise the Lord! For it is good to sing praises to God: for it is ; pleasant , and praise is beautiful! – Psalm 147:1
- ♦ Serve the Lord with gladness; come before His presence with singing. – Psalm 100:2
- 3. Praise Him with your words
- Therefore by Him let us continually offer sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of our lips, giving thanks to His name. – Hebrews 13:15
- 4. Praise Him with dancing and instruments.
- ♦ Let them praise His name with the dance; let them sing praises to Him with the timbrel and harp. – Psalm 149:3
- 5. Praise Him in fellowship with other believers
- I will declare Your name to My brethren; in the midst of the assembly I will sing praise to You. – Hebrews 2:12
