♦ Their impatience was the first step in the wrong direction.

The Calf: êgel - a young bull in his full strength

 Resembled the Egyptian bull god, Apis: A symbol of strength and power

Any image made of God obscures the glory of God.

- "To whom then will you liken God, or what likeness compare with him?" Isaiah 40:18
- We are all tempted to make a god of our own image.
- ♦ There is only one image that is worthy of our worship, His name is Jesus.

God was defining their relationship on top of the mountain and they were defiling their relationship at the bottom of it.

 "You have committed a great sin" (Exodus 30 & 31).

All law and morality must come from God's standard and character.

- The breaking of the tablets was symbolic that the people of Israel had broken the covenant they had just made with God.
