Genesis 12:1-4

- ♦ A lack of faith limits God's supernatural power in your life.
- ♦ The law of faith transcends every law of nature.

Faith is rooted in the Word of God

- ♦ Faith is our response to the Word of God. (Romans 10:17)
- ♦ Faith is not rooted in human will, desire or ambition. (Genesis 11:4)
- ♦ Faith is not rooted in human works. (Joshua 24:2, Romans 4:3-5)
- ♦ Faith is not rooted in feelings.
- ♦ Faith is not believing in spite of evidence. (Acts 7:2-3, 2 Corinthians 1:20)

Faith is acting on the Word of God.

- ♦ The requirement of faith is to obedience.
- ♦ Faith requires you to let go of control and let God direct.
- ♦ It's more about who you are becoming than where you end up.
- ♦ Faith isn't a state of mind—it's a course of action.
- Acting in faith activates the power of God in your life.
- God initiates the biggest changes in our lives through the smallest starts.

Faith is coming out to come in.

- ♦ The name Terah means, "delay."
- Haran means "parched, barren."
- When we delay in trusting God, we become dry and unfruitful.
- Your faith is not just seen by what you get out of but what you come into.
