You Can Prevail in a Pandemic Because:

You have life, you have resurrection power in you. (1 Peter 1:3-5)

- The triumph of the resurrection (Ephesians 2:1-5)
- ♦ Galatians 2:20
- ♦ A major theme in the early church was the resurrection of Jesus from the grave. (Acts 4:1-2, Acts 4:33)
- Your primary identity is not one of a sinner. Your primary identity is a son or daughter of the King of kings and Lord of lords!

Our hope is not dead because our Savior is not dead.

You have an inheritance that is imperishable. (Ezekiel 44:28, Ephesians 1:3, 1 Peter 1:6-7)

- ♦ God allows hard times to come to demonstrate that our faith is genuine.
- ♦ God refines our faith in the furnace of life, and brings triumph out of your trials.
- The hardships we face must be put into perspective by viewing them through the lens of eternity.
- ♦ There is purpose in your pain. Your faith is refined and rewarded in hard times.

There is purpose in our pain. Your faith is refined and will be rewarded. (1 Peter 1:8-9)

You have Joy inexpressible. (1 Peter 1:10-12)

- We are more blessed and more privileged than the prophets or the angels.
- They can only have imagined what we get to experience daily through Christ.
