Discussion guide:

- When you think of evil what sort of thoughts or images come to mind?
- Christian psychiatrist Dr. M. Scott Peck says that "Evil is in opposition to life."
 - How is this true? (See John 8:44)
 - o In what ways does evil "murder" or oppose life other than taking physical life?
- What is God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit's relationship to life? (See John 1:4, 7:38, 10:10, and 17:3)
- Is sin evil?
 - Why or why not? (See James 1:15)
 - o How does sin lead to death?
- Why would the fear of the Lord be hatred of evil?
- How does seeing God's goodness cause us to hate sin more?
- How does seeing ourselves more clearly in the light of or in relation to God cause us to hate sin more?
- How does seeing others more clearly in the light of or in relation to God cause us to hate sin more?
- How does seeing sin more clearly cause us to hate sin more?
