Sermon: Right, right and wrong, wrong?
Primary Text: Genesis 3, Romans 7:15, Roman 5:

Discussion Guide:

1. How do you (personally) decide what is right/good or wrong/evil?
2. Have you ever said "I know what scripture says.....but"? (Romans 7:15)
 - a. Now reconsider your answer to the first question.
3. What is the "you do you" phase really saying?
 - a. Is it truly possible to live this out in life application?
 - b. Can you see why "you do you" might be appealing, even to the believer?
 - c. Can you think of scenarios where "you do you" causes issues?
4. Consider the differences between the Holocaust, where over 12 million people, mostly civilians, were killed because they were considered "undesirable", and the inalienable rights "we know this to be self evident, all men are created equal" written by Thomas Jefferson: How is humankind able to be both Cruel and Noble (as Schaefer puts it)? Hint: (Genesis 3)
5. Why does telling people "God is good" create such an issue among non believers and believers alike?
6. What does it mean God IS Good? (Hint, the IS is important) (Psalm 119:68, Psalm 107:1, Psalm 145:9)
7. Is it possible to do "good/right" things but they are not actually good? (Matthew 23:27-28)
8. Where do you find goodness, in good deeds or a Good God?
9. Read Mark 10:17-27. What does this story say about what Jesus determines is good compared to the rich young ruler?
