Primary texts: Matthew 7:1-5; John 7:24; 1 Corinthians 4:3-5; 1 Corinthians 5:12

Discussion guide:

 - O What damage is caused when we neglect to exercise it?
 - O What must be our motivation?
- Read Matthew 7:1-5.
 - o What's the danger of judging others here?
 - o Are we still called to "remove the speck" from our brothers' eye?
 - What are we supposed to do first?
 - What does this mean?
- Read John 7:1-24.
 - o Give an overview of what's going on and what Jesus' point is.
 - o What is Jesus' point in John 7:24?
- Read 1 Corinthians 4:3-5.
 - o Why doesn't Paul care about other people's judgement or his own?
 - Is he talking about Christian brothers and sisters confronting sin in his life? or his own self-examination with regard to sin?
 - If not, what sort of judgement does he not care about?
 - Why does Paul says the Lord is the one to judge? (see 1 Samuel 16:7)

 - Give an overview of what's going on and what Paul's point is.
 - O What is his point in v. 5?
 - O What is his point in v. 12?
