 - O Why does God want us to know that there is no one like Him?
 - Why do we need to know this?
- Read 1 Samuel 2:3
 - O Why is humility before the Lord a key to peace?
- Read 1 Samuel 2:4-8
 - O What does this text tell you about God?
 - o Why can He do things that are sinful for us? ie jealousy, anger, judging, killing
 - Do you agree or disagree with the following statement: "Whatever God does is righteous because it is He who does it."
- Read 1 Samuel 2:9-10
 - O What is Hannah's point here?
 - O How can we know we are in the Lord according to this passage?
