Series: Christmas at the Movies, a study of the good news of great joy that is for all the people.

Sermon: "Won't you guide my sleigh tonight?" Jesus gives us a true light.

Primary Texts: John 1:9; 8:12; Matthew 5:16; 1 John 1:7

Discussion guide:

- What is your favorite Christmas tradition and why?
- Why do we light candles at Christmas Eve services?
- In this series we are discussing why the birth of Christ is "good news of great joy that will be for all the people." (Luke 2:10-11). Revisit this question why is Christ's birth "good news of great joy" for you today?
- Read John 1:9 this verse has been called John's version of the Christmas story. How is this true?
 - What does this passage tell us about Jesus?
 - How is Jesus "the light"? (see John 8:12)
 - o How is Jesus the true light?
 - Why is it significant that Jesus is the true light for everyone?
 - o What does this mean to you?
 - O Why is it good news of great joy for us now?
- Read 1 John 1:7 what is the instruction and promise of this text? (see John 8:12 again)
 - o How does one walk in the light?
 - O What does it look like to walk in darkness?
 - What does darkness mean in these passages?
 - O What happens when we walk in the light?
 - How does walking in the light bring fellowship with God's people?
 - How does it bring the washing of Jesus' blood?
- Read Matthew 5:14-16 how does Jesus' words here contrast with His words in John 8:12?
 - o How are we to let our light shine?
 - o What is the difference between letting our light shine and making it shine?
 - How do we let our light shine in such a way that people would "see our good works and give glory to God?"
 - o How is doing this becoming a part of something bigger that makes a difference?
