John 4:3-6

“Jesus left Judea and departed again for Galilee. 4 And he had to pass through Samaria. 5 So he came to a town of Samaria called Sychar, near the field that Jacob had given to his son Joseph. 6 Jacob's well was there; so Jesus, wearied as he was from his journey, was sitting beside the well. It was about the sixth hour.”

John 12:48 “The one who rejects me and does not receive my words has a judge; the word that I have spoken will judge him on the last day.”

John 5:43-44 “I have come in my Father's name, and you do not receive me. If another comes in his own name, you will receive him. 44 How can you believe, when you receive glory from one another and do not seek the glory that comes from the only God?”

John 1:12

“to as many who received him to them he gave the right to become children of God.”



V2 “did you RECEIVE the Spirit by works of law or by hearing with faith?

Gal 3:7-9 “Know then that it is those of faith who are the sons of Abraham. 8 And the Scripture, foreseeing that God would justify the Gentiles by faith, preached the gospel beforehand to Abraham, saying, "In you shall all the nations be blessed." 9 So then, those who are of faith are blessed along with Abraham, the man of faith.”

Gal 4:4-5

“But when the fullness of time had come, God sent forth his Son, born of woman, born under the law, to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons.”

Matt 5:17 “Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them.”

Matt 6:9-15 "Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name. 10 Your kingdom
come, your will be done, on earth as it is
in heaven. 11 Give us this day our daily
bread, 12 and forgive us our debts, as we
also have forgiven our debtors. 13 And
lead us not into temptation, but deliver
us from evil. 14 For if you forgive others
their trespasses, your heavenly Father
will also forgive you, 15 but if you do not
forgive others their trespasses, neither
will your Father forgive your trespasses."

John 19:30 “When Jesus had received the sour wine, he said, “It is finished,” and he bowed his head and gave up his spirit.”

Rom 4:5 “And to the one who does not work but trusts him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is counted as righteousness.” Exactly like Abraham’s!

Rom 4:7-8 “Blessed are those whose lawless deeds are forgiven, and whose sins are covered; 8 blessed is the man against whom the Lord will not count his sin.” **Ps 32:1-2**

Col 2:13-14 “And you, who were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made alive together with him, having forgiven us all our trespasses, 14 by canceling the record of debt that stood against us with its legal demands. This he set aside, nailing it to the cross.”

Col 3:13-14 “bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive.”

Conditional?

Jer 31:33-34 "I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts. And I will be their God, and they shall be my people. 34 And no longer shall each one teach his neighbor and each his brother, saying, 'Know the Lord,' for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, declares the Lord. For I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more."

Acts 13:38-39 “Let it be known to you therefore, brothers, that through this man forgiveness of sins is proclaimed to you, and by him everyone who believes is freed from everything from which you could not be freed by the law of Moses.”

2 Cor 5:19 “in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation.”

Heb 8:12-13 “For I will be merciful toward their iniquities, and I will remember their sins no more.” In speaking of a new covenant, he makes the first one obsolete. And what is becoming obsolete and growing old is ready to vanish away.”

1 John 1:7-10

“But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. 8 If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. 9 If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. 10 If we say we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us”

1 John 2:12 “I am writing to you, little children, because your sins are forgiven for his name's sake.”

Heb 9:26b "... but now once at the consummation of the ages He (Jesus) has been manifested to put away sin by the sacrifice of Himself.

John 1:29 "The next day he (John the Baptist) saw Jesus coming to him and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!"

1 John 2:2 "He Himself is the propitiation for our sins; and not for ours only, but also for those of the whole world."
