

# Freedom In The Spirit

#### Start Talking. Conversation starter for your group.

• What is your definition of freedom? Are there any times in your life where you haven't felt free? Why is freedom so important?

## Start Thinking.

- When Christ sets you free, you are free from the penalty of sin. What is the penalty of sin?
- Read Romans 6:1-7. Why can knowing that God's grace is never ending be problematic for a person? (v. 1 a person could "excuse" their sin)
- In v. 2, Paul says we are dead to sin. What does this mean?
- If we are dead to sin, why do we still sin? Refer to Romans 7:15-20.
- When Christ sets you free, you are free from the pressure of the law. What does this mean?
- Read Romans 3:19-20. Why was the law given to God's people? What would happen if there was no law?
- When Christ sets you free, you are free from you. What are some of the things that people need to be set free from when it comes to themselves?
- Read Galatians 5:13-18. What does Paul tell the church to use their freedom for? Why do you think loving and serving others is so important?

### Start Sharing.

- Being aware of your sin is important. When are you most aware of your sin? Why is being aware of your sin important as a follower of Jesus?
- Do you ever say, "I'm saved so if I sin, at least I'm going to heaven"? Why is this wrong?
- Would you describe yourself, and would others describe you as selfish or selfless? Do you find it hard to love others? Why or why not?
- Who are the hardest people for you to love? Why? Are there people in your life that you just can't love? What would happen if you did?

## Start Doing.

 Think of one way to love and serve someone this week that you normally do not serve, then do it!
