Based off of 1 Corinthians 11:1, does your life look Jesus? Why or why not?

Pastor Chris challenged us to invite people to church and to preach the Gospel to people in our community. Does this challenge intimidate you? Why or why not?

Talk with your group about something in your life that is hindering you from fully living your life like Jesus. Ask for accountability from your group to help you grow in your relationship with Jesus.

Who is someone in your life that you can invite to Easter At Vision? Who in your life needs Jesus? After the people in your group have shared, intentionally spend time in prayer for the people mentioned, by name, and ask God to give you courage and boldness to approach them this week.

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
