Read Galatians 5:25-26

- Pastor Chris said that love assumes the best. What does this mean? When do you find it hard to assume the best about others? Why?

Read Galatians 6:1

- Do you find it hard to hold people accountable when they are in sin? Why or why not?
- How do you restore a person that is habitually in sin?
- Read Proverbs 18:21. Why are the words you use so powerful? Do you struggle with the things you say (about others or about yourself)? Why?

Read Galatians 6:2-5

- Why do you think bearing burdens is such a big deal? Are you better at burden bearing or burden sharing? Why?
- Pastor Chris said that Hurt people hurt people. But forgiven people forgive people. Dig deep - is it hard for you to forgive people? Is there anything you consider unforgivable? Is there anything Christ says is unforgivable in your life?
