What:

- Epaphras is traveling to go see Paul in Rome to inform Paul about the heresies spreading throughout the church.
- The type of heresies are the founding fathers of the same false teachings we see today. (asceticism & Mysticism)

When: Was written around 61 A.D. (29 years after Christ's crucifixion)

Where: In Colossae, about 13 miles from Hierapolis in Asia Minor. (modern-day Turkey, Iran, Syria)

Why:

- The Colossian church was a Pauline church, meaning it was a result of Paul's ministry, therefore, we find Epaphras' instruction on what he should do about the growing division in the church.
- If the body of Christ does not pray and ask God to fill new and younger believers with all the spiritual wisdom and understanding there is in Christ, we may be doing a disservice to the body and possibly hindering the solid growth of the Church.
