Why Some Prayers Don't Work

Sometimes we struggle in prayer because we're trying to get God to do something He's already done. We're asking Him to defeat an enemy He defeated 2,000 years ago. We're requesting protection He's already provided.

Instead of begging God to rescue you from someone you've already been rescued from, stand in faith on what Christ has already accomplished. Declare the victory that's already yours.

The Power of Your Words

Job 3:25 reveals a sobering truth: "For the thing I greatly feared has come upon me, and what I dreaded has happened to me." Fear spoken becomes fear manifested. What you consistently talk about, you give power to in your life.

The Bible says life and death are in the power of the tongue. If you're constantly talking about your problems, fears, and worries, you're giving the enemy legal ground to bring those things into your life.

Speaking Life Instead of Death

Instead of saying what you have (problems), start saying what you want to have (solutions). Instead of talking your fears, start talking God's promises. Let the weak say "I am strong" rather than constantly confessing weakness.

Your tongue is the rudder of your life's ship. Take control of where your life is heading by taking control of what you're saying.

Legal Rights in the Spirit Realm

Demons operate legally—they can't just do whatever they want. They need legal ground, which often comes through our words, actions, and attitudes. When we operate in fear, pride, or unbelief, we can give the enemy access to areas of our lives.

The good news is that if you've given the devil legal ground, you can take it back through repentance. God doesn't just forgive what you've done wrong—He cleanses you from all unrighteousness and restores what the enemy has stolen.

New Testament Believers Have Greater Protection

If Job could be protected by God's hedge without being born again or having the Holy Spirit living inside him, how much more are we protected as New Testament believers? Christ

has redeemed us from the curse of the law. We don't have to choose between different evils—Jesus took them all.

When you mess up, you don't have to live under condemnation or expect punishment. You can immediately repent, receive forgiveness, and walk in the full protection of your hedge.

Life Application

This week, make a conscious decision to live from the reality of your divine protection rather than from fear or anxiety. Start each day by declaring that you are in Christ, hedged in behind and before, with God's hand upon your life.

Pay attention to your words. When you catch yourself speaking fear, problems, or negativity, immediately stop and speak the opposite. Declare God's promises over your situation instead of rehearsing your problems.

Develop a consistent private prayer life where you can communicate with God about things that concern you. Come out of those prayer times filled with faith rather than anxiety, confident that God has heard you and is working on your behalf.

Questions for Reflection:

- Am I living with the confidence that comes from knowing I'm protected by God's hedge, or am I constantly worried about what the enemy might do to me?
- What negative words have I been speaking that might be giving the enemy legal ground in my life?
- Do I have a consistent private prayer life where I can communicate intimately with God about my concerns?
- When challenges arise, do I immediately think I'm "under attack," or do I remember that the devil is under my feet?
