

Real Eternal Freedom

Freedom is something most people want but few truly understand. On the surface, independence means no one controls you. But real freedom, the kind that lasts, actually requires dependence on the right source. Here is what that means for your life as a follower of Christ.

What Does Independence Really Mean?

Independence is the state of being free from the control, rule, or influence of another. It means having the liberty and ability to govern yourself and make your own decisions.

But here is the key insight that changes everything: independence requires dependence.

As an American citizen, you enjoy freedom because you are part of something. You are dependent on your citizenship. Without that, the freedoms do not apply to you.

Independence does not mean isolation. It means being connected to something that promotes liberty.

The same principle is true spiritually.

What Does the Bible Say About Spiritual Citizenship?

The Apostle Paul made it clear where a Christian's true citizenship lies:

"For our citizenship is in heaven, from which we also eagerly wait for the Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ." - Philippians 3:20

You are not just a citizen of a nation on earth. You are a citizen of heaven. And that citizenship comes with rights, authority, and access to the full power of God on your behalf.

Even if earthly freedoms were stripped away, your heavenly citizenship cannot be taken from you. You would have to choose to give it up. It is yours by the new birth.

Does God Want to Control Your Life?

This is one of the most misunderstood ideas in Christianity. God does not want to dominate you. He does not want to micromanage every decision you make.

Look at how independence is defined: freedom from outside control, domination, or dependence, with the ability to act according to one's own authority or responsibility. That is exactly what God wants for you.

He wants you to exercise self-control. He wants you to take responsibility for your life. He gives you His name, His Spirit, His Word, and His power so that you can walk in total freedom, not so that you become dependent on Him the way a prisoner depends on a warden.

Religion will try to bring you into bondage. It will turn a relationship into a list of rules. It will make church something you have to do instead of something you get to do. That is not from God. That is the wrong Spirit at work.

Who Is Really Behind Bondage and Oppression?

The Bible is clear that there are spiritual forces working to dominate and control people's lives. These are the principalities and powers that operate in the spiritual realm, and their goal is to bring people into bondage.

Jesus warned about the gateway of the eyes and ears:

"The lamp of the body is the eye. If therefore your eye is good, your whole body will be full of light. But if your eye is bad, your whole body will be full of darkness." - Matthew 6:22-23

What you look at and what you listen to matters. Demonic influence does not always look dramatic. It can come through what you expose yourself to, what you allow into your mind, and what you speak out of your mouth.

"Death and life are in the power of the tongue." - Proverbs 18:21

Watch what you are saying. You are directing your life with your words.

What Happens When You Cry Out to God?

Psalms 18 gives one of the most powerful pictures in all of Scripture of what happens when a child of God calls out for help:

"In my distress I called upon the Lord, and cried out to my God; He heard my voice from His temple, and my cry came before Him, even to His ears." - Psalm 18:6

And then what happened? The earth shook. Fire came from His mouth. He rode on the wings of the wind. He sent out His arrows and scattered the enemy. He reached down and pulled His child out of the deep waters.

God is not passive when one of His citizens cries out in faith. He moves. He fights. He delivers. The same power that raised Jesus from the dead is the same power available to you in every situation you face.

How Does Knowing Your Citizenship Give You Authority?

In Acts 22, Paul was bound and about to be flogged. He simply looked at the soldier and asked one question:

"Is it lawful for you to scourge a man who is a Roman, and uncondemned?" - Acts 22:25

Immediately, the soldiers withdrew. His citizenship protected him. He did not have to fight. He just had to know who he was.

That is the same authority you carry as a citizen of heaven. When the enemy comes against you with sickness, fear, oppression, or confusion, you have the right to ask: is it lawful? You are covered by the blood of Jesus. You have a covenant with Almighty God. The devil is hoping you do not know that.

How Do You Stay Free Once You Have Been Set Free?

Paul wrote this direct instruction to believers:

"Stand fast therefore in the liberty by which Christ has made us free, and do not be entangled again with a yoke of bondage." - Galatians 5:1

He was writing to Christians. People who had already been set free. His warning was that freedom can be lost, not because God takes it back, but because people get seduced out of it. They drift from relationship into religion. From grace into legalism. From freedom into fear.

You have to stand fast. You have to decide: I have been set free, and I am staying free.

The same God who delivered you then is the same God who delivers you now. His power has not changed. His love for you has not changed. Your testimony is not just something that happened in the past. It is evidence of what He still does today.

What Does It Mean to Depend on God Without Losing Your Freedom?

True faith is dependence on God. Not dependence that strips you of your identity or your choices, but dependence that empowers you to walk in greater freedom than you ever could on your own.

The Holy Spirit is called the Helper. He does not come to take over your life. He comes alongside you to help you carry your responsibilities well. You still make decisions. You still move forward. But you do it with His wisdom, His power, and His presence backing you up.

He gives you the desires of your heart. He trusts you with your own life. He is not putting a ceiling over your potential. Everything He guides you toward is designed to expand you, increase your impact, and help you live as the free person He created you to be.

Have You Ever Made Jesus the Lord of Your Life?

If you have never stepped into this freedom, the door is open. Jesus did not come to judge or condemn. He came as a liberator. Your choice to follow Him is exactly that: a choice. He will never force it.

"If the Son makes you free, you shall be free indeed." - John 8:36

Call on Him. Believe in Him. He is not looking to control your life. He is looking to set you free.

Life Application

This week, identify one area of your life where you have been living in bondage rather than freedom. It might be fear, a habit, a mindset, or a religious obligation that has become a burden rather than a blessing. Take a moment to remind yourself of who you are as a citizen of heaven. Speak it out loud. Tell the enemy what belongs to you. Then take one practical step forward in faith, trusting that God is already moving on your behalf.

Ask yourself these questions:

- Am I walking in the freedom Christ purchased for me, or have I drifted back into some form of bondage?
- Do I truly believe that God fights for me when I cry out to Him, or do I feel like I am on my own?
- Is my relationship with God built on love and freedom, or has it become a list of things I have to do to stay in His good graces?
- Am I taking responsibility for my life and decisions, trusting the Holy Spirit to help me, or am I waiting for God to control every step?

Freedom is not just a gift you receive once. It is something you stand in every day. You are a citizen of heaven. Walk like it.

Summary

Galatians 5:1 warns believers not to be entangled again in a yoke of bondage, because freedom can be lost not when God takes it back, but when people drift away from it. What you allow through your eyes, your ears, and your mouth shapes the direction of your life. When you cry out to God in faith, He responds with power, just as He did in Psalm 18. The same power that raised Jesus from the dead is available to you today. Know who you are, stand in what belongs to you, and walk in the freedom Christ purchased for you.
