How to Have God's Best

God wants to take us much further than where we currently are. He has a vision for our lives that goes beyond what we can imagine. But to reach that vision, we need to embrace His heart and His plan rather than simply following our own desires.

What Does God Want You to Do?

The most important question we should ask ourselves is not "What do I want to do?" but rather "What does God want me to do?" There's something powerful about knowing you're doing exactly what you were created for in the moment you're doing it. When you're in God's perfect will for your life, you experience a sense of purpose that can't be matched by following your own plans.

Living in God's will is key to experiencing a long, healthy, prosperous, fruitful, and blessed life. Outside of His will, there are no guarantees.

Three Levels of God's Will

Romans 12:1-2 tells us: "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service. And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God."

There are three levels of God's will:

- Good (30% fruit)
- Acceptable (60% fruit)
- Perfect (100% fruit)

Many people settle for "good" when God wants to take them to "perfect." Good is better than nothing, but God doesn't want us to be satisfied with just the basics.

How Do We Move Toward God's Perfect Will?

There are two key components to discovering and living in God's perfect will:

- **Present your body as a living sacrifice** This means restraining your flesh and not allowing it to express itself however it wants. Your flesh needs to be "strapped down" like a sacrifice tied to the altar.
- **Be transformed by renewing your mind** This happens when you align your thinking with God's Word rather than the world's way of thinking.

Why Is Controlling Your Tongue So Important?

The first part of your body that needs to be brought under control is your tongue. James tells us that the tongue is like a rudder to a ship - it directs your whole body and life. If you can control your tongue, you'll likely be able to control the rest of your body.

Many people telegraph where they're headed by what comes out of their mouth. Often, if something doesn't come out of your mouth, you won't end up doing it. Your words can reveal the direction you're going, whether positive or negative.

Being Spiritual Is Being Practical

True spirituality isn't about strange rituals or appearing "different." It's about being practical and having self-control. God's way is the easy way, not the difficult one. Jesus said, "My yoke is easy, my burden is light." It's the way of the transgressor that is hard.

The world has convinced many people that following God is difficult and doing your own thing is easy, but the opposite is true. Living outside God's will wears you down and robs you of quality life.

The Holy Spirit Makes Spiritual Living Possible

Romans 8:13 says, "If by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live." The key phrase is "by the Spirit." You can't control your flesh in your own strength - that's why you needed to be saved in the first place.

The Holy Spirit helps you live a supernatural life. He teaches you through God's Word and gives you the power to do what He shows you. When you open your Bible, you're inviting the Holy Spirit to come and help you understand and apply what you read.

Moving From Struggle to Mastery

When you first begin to control your flesh, it's a struggle. You're constantly having to restrain yourself. But if you stay faithful and consistent, eventually your body will be trained to cooperate with your spirit.

It's like training a dog or programming a self-driving car. At first, it requires intense focus and effort, but eventually, you can put things on "autopilot" because you've trained yourself so well that godly responses become automatic.

This progression mirrors the Israelites' journey:

- Egypt represents working in the flesh
- The wilderness represents struggling with trusting God
- The Promised Land represents flowing in God's perfect will

Life Application

Take some time to honestly assess where you are in your spiritual journey:

- Are you someone who hears the Word but never applies it? (The wayside person)
- Are you in the "good" level of God's will, struggling but making progress?
- Are you in the "acceptable" level, seeing significant fruit?
- Are you moving toward the "perfect" will of God, where you're bearing maximum fruit?

No matter where you are, there's hope to move forward. Here are some practical steps to take this week:

- Identify one area where your flesh (especially your tongue) needs more control
- Invite the Holy Spirit specifically to help you in that area
- Spend time in God's Word focusing on verses related to that struggle
- Practice restraint when tempted, relying on the Spirit's power
- Remember that it gets easier as you progress

Ask yourself: Am I settling for "good" when God wants to give me His best? What specific area of my life needs to move from "good" to "perfect" this week? How can I better cooperate with the Holy Spirit to make this happen?

We only get one shot at this life. Let's overcome every adversity and experience God's best by committing to do our best to have His best.
