When he heard Esau was coming with men, he was "greatly afraid and distressed" (Gen. 32:6–7).			
	<b>Manipulation &amp; Scheming.</b> Rather than fully trusting in God, Jacob came up with his own strategy.		
	HIS HOPE WAS THAT "" ESAU WOULD BE APPEASED (GEN. 32:6–8, 20–21).		
•	<b>Prayer &amp; Promises.</b> Jacob asked God to remember His promises (Gen. 28:13–15; 32:9–12).		
	This is Jacob's recorded prayer since his vow at Bethel (Gen. 28:20–22).		
JACOB'S MEETING WITH GOD			
	<b>Submission.</b> The wrestling match was initiated by God (Gen. 32:24; cp. Hos. 12:3–4). It was not to defeat Jacob, but to bring him to a place of		
•	Struggle. Jacob spent his life in with Esau (Gen. 25–27), Isaac (Gen. 27), Laban (Gen. 29–31), his wives (Gen. 30), and now, ultimately, with God Himself (Gen. 32:28).		
	<b>Sight.</b> Jacob walked away with a limp, a changed name, and a changed heart (Gen. 32:27–30). His limp was a reminder that God's strength is made perfect in (cp. 2 Cor. 12:7-10).
