Isaiah 6:1-7, NKJV

“In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lifted up, and the train of His robe filled the temple. Above it stood seraphim; each one had six wings: with two he covered his face, with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. And one cried to another and said: “Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; The whole earth is full of His glory!” And the posts of the door were shaken by the voice of him who cried out, and the house was filled with smoke. So I said: “Woe is me, for I am undone! Because I am a man of unclean lips, And I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; For my eyes have seen the King, The Lord of hosts.” Then one of the seraphim flew to me, having in his hand a live coal which he had taken with the tongs from the altar. And he touched my mouth with it, and said: “Behold, this has touched your lips; Your iniquity is taken away, And your sin purged.””

Textual Questions

According to Isaiah 6:1–4, what did Isaiah see surrounding the throne of the Lord?

What confession did Isaiah make in Isaiah 6:5 after seeing the Lord?

In Isaiah 6:8, how did Isaiah respond when the Lord asked, “Whom shall I send?”

According to Isaiah 53:4–6, who bore the griefs, sorrows, and iniquities of the people?

In John 12:42, why did some people refuse to confess Jesus?

Connecting Questions

Why do you think people who encountered God’s presence in Scripture often became more aware of their own sinfulness?

What connections do you see between the glorious king in Isaiah 6 and the suffering servant in Isaiah 53?

Why is it sometimes easier to admire Jesus privately than confess Him publicly?

What are some modern examples of people fearing the approval of others more than obedience to God?

How does Isaiah 53 challenge the idea that suffering always means failure or weakness?

Isaiah saw a glorious King on a throne and a suffering servant led to slaughter. John says both visions were about Jesus. The question we will explore in this lesson is: How can Jesus be both exalted and rejected at the same time?

Three Moments Isaiah Experienced in the Temple

- **Isaiah _____ the Lord lifted up (Isa. 6:1-4).** Isaiah received a vision of a holy king surrounded by superhuman creatures.
- **Isaiah _____ unfit to be in the Lord's presence (Isa. 6:5-7).** The closer Isaiah came, the more he was aware of his sin.
- **Isaiah _____ a difficult commission (Isa. 6:8-10).** Isaiah volunteered to take a message to people who would reject it.

Three Revelations Isaiah Learned About the Servant

- **The servant is _____ and rejected (Isa. 53:1-3).** The rejection of the servant reveals how spiritually blind people can become (cp. Isa. 52:10).
- **The servant is _____ to bring peace (Isa. 53:4-6).** The consequences of sin are laid upon the sinless servant.
- **The servant is led like a _____ to the slaughter (Isa. 53: 7-9).** The innocent servant suffers without putting up a fight.

Three Connections Between Isaiah and Jesus

- **Isaiah predicted _____ (Jn. 12:38-40).** Both passages in Isaiah predicted the servant and his message would be rejected (cp. 1 Pet. 2:21-25; Ac. 3:14-18).
- **Isaiah saw the _____ of Jesus (Jn. 12:41).** The Lord on the throne was also the servant who suffered (cp. two messiah theory; Leper Messiah; 1 Cor. 1:23).
- **The people saw the _____ and struggled (Jn. 12:37, 42-43).** They heard the voice, saw the signs, and still refused to be healed (cp. Mt. 23:37; Jn. 5:40).

- **Entering the presence of the Lord is serious.** Those who encountered the Lord left more aware of who God was and who they were not. Biblically speaking, we will not come before the King and tell Him what to do.
- **Experiencing the mercy of the Lord is personal.** The “our” and the “we” in Isaiah 53 includes us. The Servant suffers not because of what He had done, but because of what we have done.
- **Staying on the sidelines is dangerous.** Many people believed in Jesus, but stayed silent because they feared people more than God. At some point, we have to move our faith from private to public.
