ABRAHAM (3)January 21, 2024

Scripture Reading

Genesis 22:1-6

"Now it came to pass after these things that God tested Abraham, and said to him, "Abraham!" And he said, "Here I am." Then He said, "Take now your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains of which I shall tell you." So Abraham rose early in the morning and saddled his donkey, and took two of his young men with him, and Isaac his son; and he split the wood for the burnt offering, and arose and went to the place of which God had told him. Then on the third day Abraham lifted his eyes and saw the place afar off. And Abraham said to his young men, "Stay here with the donkey; the lad and I will go yonder and worship, and we will come back to you." So Abraham took the wood of the burnt offering and laid it on Isaac his son; and he took the fire in his hand, and a knife, and the two of them went together." (Genesis 22:1–6, NKJV)

How do we respond to abundance & blessing?

Indulgence - Entitlement - Stock pile - Share

"Give me neither poverty nor riches" (Proverbs 30:7-9)

THE GRACE OF GOD

- God did not begin by punishing Adam and Eve but by cursing the serpent and promising hope (Gen. 3:14-15).
- God chose to deal with a depraved world by giving it another chance and starting over (Gen. 6:5-8).
- God chose to confuse those who believed life on earth was about human independence and self-sufficiency (Gen. 11:1-9).

THE PLAN OF GOD

- A distinct land: God called Abraham to enter and dwell in a fertile land so his family could bless other nations (Gen. 12:1; 13:15; 15:14).
- A distinct family: God focuses on one specific family to be a kingdom of priests and serve on His behalf (Gen. 12:2; 14:18-24; Ex. 19:6).
- A special blessing: Abraham's offspring will bring blessings to every human, especially his chosen "Seed" (Gen. 12:3; 22:18; Gal. 3:16).

THE PROMISES OF GOD

- Blessing & God's family: The brokenness of humanity, the earth, and the nations is addressed in God's promises to Abraham (Gen. 12:1-6). The apostle Paul called this "the gospel" (Gal. 3:8).
- Covenant & God's oath: God's promises to Abraham serve as the starting point for His mission to save rebellious humanity (Gen. 15:6). God will always uphold His end of the covenant (Ex. 2:24; 32:13).
- Abraham & God's promise: The father of faith wasn't always faithful but God still chose to bless the world through one man (Gen. 16:1-2; 22:1-18). Abraham looked to Jesus' day and was glad (Heb. 11:13-19).
