Scripture Reading

1 Samuel 16:10-13

"Thus Jesse made seven of his sons pass before Samuel. And Samuel said to Jesse, "The LORD has not chosen these." And Samuel said to Jesse, "Are all the young men here?" Then he said, "There remains yet the youngest, and there he is, keeping the sheep." And Samuel said to Jesse, "Send and bring him. For we will not sit down till he comes here." So he sent and brought him in. Now he was ruddy, with bright eyes, and good-looking. And the LORD said, "Arise, anoint him; for this is the one!" Then Samuel took the horn of oil and anointed him in the midst of his brothers; and the Spirit of the LORD came upon David from that day forward. So Samuel arose and went to Ramah." (1 Samuel 16:10–13, NKJV)

STEPPING STONES: OUR JOURNEY TO DAVID

- Adam and Eve dwelt with God in the garden until they disobeyed God (Gen. 3:1-6; Rom. 5:12-17).
- God made a covenant with Abraham in an attempt to restore His broken relationship with humanity (Gen. 15:1-6; Ex. 19:3-6).
- The tabernacle became the way God dwelt with His people and the way they served Him (Ex. 24-30; cp. Heb. 9:1-5).

BUILDING BLOCKS: OUR VIEW OF DAVID

- God sought and selected a king after His own heart; a young man named, David (1 Sam. 13:13-14: 16:1, 11-13).
- David is from Judah, the royal line that will become a dynasty of kings until the eternal ruler comes (Gen. 49:10-12; 1 Sam. 17:12).
- David is connected to Jerusalem, anointed by God, and ruler over a specific group of people (Gen. 14:18-20; 1 Sam. 2:27-36; 2 Sam. 6:14).

LAUNCHING PAD: HOW DAVID FITS IN THE STORY

- David, as king over Judah and Israel, is the unifier of a divided nation under God (2 Sam. 5:1-5; Jer. 31:31-34).
- David, acting as priest and king, brings the Ark of the covenant to Jerusalem (2 Sam. 6:12-19; Zach. 4:14; 6:12-14).
- David, as a descendant of Judah, will pioneer a permanent dynasty through his future descendants (2 Sam. 7:12-16; 1 Kg. 8:20; Hos. 3:5).
