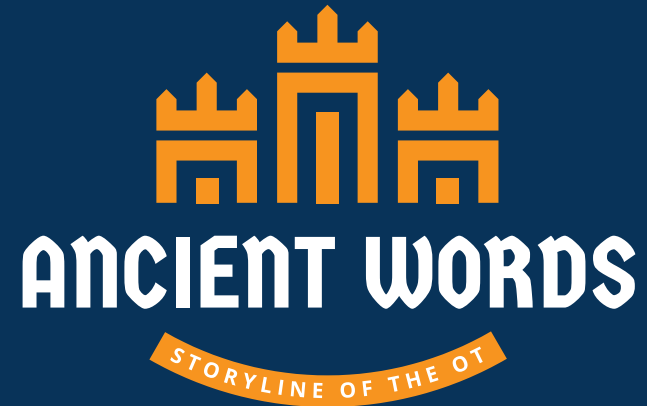

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EXODUS (4)

January 28, 2024

Scripture Reading

Exodus 3:1-8

"Now Moses was tending the flock of Jethro his father-in-law, the priest of Midian. And he led the flock to the back of the desert, and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. And the Angel of the LORD appeared to him in a flame of fire from the midst of a bush.

So he looked, and behold, the bush was burning with fire, but the bush was not consumed. Then Moses said, "I will now turn aside and see this great sight, why the bush does not burn." So when the LORD saw that he turned aside to look, God called to him from the midst of the bush and said, "Moses, Moses!" And he said, "Here I am." Then He said, "Do not draw near this place. Take your sandals off your feet, for the place where you stand is holy ground." Moreover He said, "I am the God of your father—the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob." And Moses hid his face, for he was afraid to look upon God. And the LORD said: "I have surely seen the oppression of My people who are in Egypt, and have heard their cry... (continued)

Digging Deeper For Further Study

The sections below contain "starting points" for biblical and historical discussions that cannot be discussed at length in the sermon. Technical terms are used to help look for specific information.

THE BACKSTORY

Tetragrammaton (the covenant name of God given to Moses)

THE EXODUS

Redemption (various uses in the Old and New Testament)

THE IMAGERY

Passover (how the Jewish practice relates to the Lord's Supper)
Jesus is "the Lamb of God" who died as the Passover lamb.

The Picture of Freedom

THE BACKSTORY

- The family of Abraham journeyed to Egypt and remained there for over 400 years, just as God predicted (Gen. 15:13-15; Ac. 7:6).
- As administrations changed, life became extremely difficult for the children of Israel for an extended period (Ex. 1:1-10, 22; 7:7).
- The children of Israel endure slavery for many years; God hears their cry for help, and He comes to rescue them (Ex. 2:23-25; 3:7-10; 6:6-8).

THE EXODUS

- Moses previously tried to deliver Israel (Ex. 2:11-22). Forty years later, God reveals His plan for Moses to deliver Israel from slavery and bring them back to their homeland (Ex. 2:23-4:17).
- God used a series of plagues so both Egypt and Israel would know He is the Lord (Ex. 3:13-15; 6:2-8; 7:5, 17).
- The people see the salvation of God in the Passover meal and Red Sea crossing (Ex. 12:12-13, 21-28; 14:1-9, 13-14, 24-31).

THE IMAGERY

- *YHWH*: The tetragrammaton and the power of Jesus' name (Ex. 3:12-14; Ac. 2:21, 38; 3:16; 4:10-12; 8:12; 10:43, 48; 19:5).
- *Substitute*: The Paschal Lamb and the Lamb of God (Ex. 12:24-28; Jn. 19:31-37; 1 Cor. 5:7).
- *New Life*: The Baptism of Moses and Baptism of Christ (Ex. 12:40-41; 14:13-14; 1 Cor. 10:1-4; Mt. 28:18-21).
