# The Temptation of Every Man Genesis 3:1-7

### A. Introduction

- 1. Pastor Joe believes in a literal 7-day creation story and this literal temptation story. This story of "the fall" is literal, not metaphorical.
- 2. By understanding how temptation works, we can devise a strategy to gain victory and overcome temptation.
- 3. By looking closer at this story, we see the importance of man's role in God's plan.

# **B. Study Section**

1. Satan is always crafty and deceptive, and he bends the truth.

**Genesis 3:1, NASB95** – <sup>1</sup> Now the serpent was <u>more crafty than any</u> beast of the field which the Lord God had made....

2. Satan always challenges the authority of God's Word.

**Genesis 3:1, NASB95** - 1 ... And [Satan] said to the woman, "Indeed, has God said, 'You shall not eat from any tree of the garden'?"

**Genesis 2:16–17, NASB95** - <sup>16</sup> [God said]..."<u>From any tree of the garden you may eat freely;</u> <sup>17</sup> but <u>from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat ..."</u>

"Satan's statement conveys the assumption that God's Word is subject to our judgment." Dr. Derek Kidner (*Genesis*, IVP, p. 76.)

3. Satan always questions God's character.

"LORD GOD" (formal) v.1 vs. "Lord" (personal) in vv. 2-13.

4. Satan always contradicts the certainty of God's judgment.

**Genesis 3:4, NASB95** - 4 The serpent said to the woman, "You surley will not die!

5. Satan always promises the pleasure but omits the pain.

**Genesis 3:5, NASB95** - <sup>5</sup> "For God knows that in the day you eat from it your eyes will be opened, and <u>you will be like God</u>, knowing good and evil."

# **C. Overcoming Temptation**

- 1. Know that when Satan speaks, "he is ALWAYS lying."
- 2. God will never lead you to do something contrary to His Word.
- 3. We must affirm the consequences of sin.
- 4. We must remember that sin will bring forth a pain which will outlast momentary pleasure.
- 5. The biblical prescription for sin is to "flee."

1 Corinthians 6:18, NKJV - 18 Flee sexual immorality...

**Psalm 119:11, NKJV** - <sup>11</sup> <u>Your word I have hidden in my heart,</u> That I <u>might not sin against You</u>.

## D. A Word to Men

- 1. God made man (Adam) first—then woman (Eve).
- 2. When God made Adam, God gave him his responsibility and made a covenant with Adam. (See Ex. 3:15 and Ex. 24:23)
- 3. That covenant made Adam responsible for the family.
- 4. When Adam and Eve fell, God didn't ask, "Where are y'all?" God asked, "Adam, where are you?"
- 5. The Bible says, "In Adam, all men die."
  - **1 Corinthians 15:22, NASB95** <sup>22</sup> For as <u>in Adam all die</u>, so also in Christ all will be made alive. (See Romans 5:12)
- 6. The biggest temptation you face as a man is to not be the <u>protector</u>, the <u>provider</u>, the <u>prophet</u> (spiritual leader) and <u>priest</u> (spiritual advocate) in your home.
