1 Samuel 21:1-2 and Psalm 142

A. PSALM 119 - Overview

Insights:

- 1. David is at one of the lowest points in his life.
- 2. He has left the security of Samuel.
- 3. He is running, under the threat of death, from King Saul.
- 4. He seeks the counsel of a prophet named Ahimelech.
- 5. David lies to him, eats the sacrificial bread, among other sins.
- 6. When Saul finds out David talked to Ahimelech, he slaughters the whole priestly order—85 priests in all.
- 7. He goes to see the city of Gath to seek the counsel of the prophet Achish.
- 8. He enters the city of Gath carrying Goliath's sword that he got from Achish.
- 9. Now, more people than you can imagine are trying to kill David.
- 10. We all have a cave!

1 Samuel 22:1–2, NLT - ¹ So David left Gath and escaped to the cave of <u>Adullam</u>. Soon his brothers and all his other relatives joined him there. ² Then others began coming—men who were in trouble or in debt or who were just discontented—until David was the captain of about 400 men.

- A. David is running from his problems (v. 1a).
- B. His family, fearing Saul's wrath, also flees to the cave. (v. 1b).
- C. 400 men in "distress, in debt, and discontented" flee to the cave (v. 2b).
- D. He then takes his parents to Moab for safety (vv. 3-4).
- E. In Moab, the prophet Gad tells David to go back to Judah. (v. 5).

THOUGHT #1 – Be careful who your <u>counselors</u> are.

THOUGHT #2 – Be careful who your comforters are.

B. Psalm 142 - Inside David's Cave (and Heart)

1. David feels Disoriented.

Psalm 142:3, NASB95 - ³ When my spirit was <u>overwhelmed</u> within me...

2. David feels Deserted.

Psalm 142:4, NLT - ⁴ I look for someone to come and help me, but <u>no one gives me a passing thought!</u> No one will help me; no one cares a bit what happens to me.

3. David feels Depressed.

Psalm 142:6, NASB95 - 6 "...For I am brought very low..."

4. David feels Discouraged.

Psalm 142:7, NASB95 - **Bring my soul out of prison..."

C. How to Behave in a Cave

1. Tell God what's going on in your life.

Psalm 142:1, NASB95 - 1 *I cry aloud...to the LORD...*

Psalm 142:2, NASB95 - ² I pour out my complaint before Him...

Psalm 142:6, NASB95 - Give heed to my cry...

2. Realize God is not unaware.

Psalm 142:3, NASB95 - ³ When my spirit was overwhelmed within me, <u>You knew my path</u>. In the way <u>where I walk</u> They have hidden a trap for me.

3. Know that God is with you.

Psalm 142:5, NASB95 - ⁵ I cried out to You, O LORD; I said, "You are my refuge, My portion in the land of the living.

4. Believe—God's got this.

Psalm 142:7, NASB95 - ⁷ "Bring my soul out of prison, So that I may give thanks to Your name; The righteous will surround me, For You will deal bountifully with me."

At Kadesh Barnea, first group of spies saw their problem in relationship to <u>their own resources</u> and were frightened; Jashua and Caleb saw their problem in relationship to <u>God's resources</u> and were encouraged and had faith.
