🧕 Study Section — Philippians 1:15-20

1. Paul's _

Philippians 1:12–14, NIV - ¹² Now I want you to know, brothers, that what has happened to me has really served to advance the gospel. ¹³ As a result, it has become clear throughout the whole palace guard and to everyone else that <u>I am in chains for Christ</u>. ¹⁴ Because of my chains, most of the brothers in the Lord have been encouraged to speak the word of God more courageously and fearlessly.

2. Paul's _____

Philippians 1:15–18, NLT -¹⁵ It's true that some are preaching out of jealousy and rivalry. But others preach about Christ with pure motives.

¹⁶ They preach because they love me, for they know I have been appointed [lit., destined, a military word meaning, "I am called to duty for the purpose..."] to defend [Gk: apologia, meaning (legally) "to give a defense"; 'Why did you do that?" or 'What do you believe that?"] the Good News. ¹⁷ Those others do not have pure motives as they preach about Christ. They preach with selfish ambition, not sincerely, intending to make my chains more painful to me. ¹⁸ But that doesn't matter. Whether their motives are false or genuine, the message about Christ is being preached either way, so I rejoice. And I will continue to rejoice.

Philippians 1:18, NIV84 - ¹⁸ But what does it matter? The important thing is that in every way, whether from false motives or true, <u>Christ is preached</u> [a unique word for "proclaiming," lit., preached with authority and power]. And because of this I rejoice. Yes, and I will continue to rejoice....

3. Paul's _____

Philippians 1:19–20, TLB - ¹⁹ I am going to keep on being glad, for I know that as you <u>pray</u> [ie., intense intercession] for me, and as the Holy Spirit helps me, this is all going to turn out for my good. ²⁰ For I live in eager expectation [Gk: ἀποκαραδοκία (apo-kara-dokia) apo=turn from; kara=head; dokia=to watch intently; lit., 'To watch for something so intently that the head is turned away from everything else' and hope that I will never do anything that will cause me to be ashamed of myself but that I will always be ready to speak out boldly for Christ while I am going through all these trials here, just as I have in the past; and that I will always be an honor to Christ, whether I live or whether I must die.
