BACKGROUND ON DANIEL CHAPTER SIX

- A. 10 years have passed between Daniel Chapters 5 and 6.
- B. Darius the Mede (Chapter 5), pronounce "DAR-ee-us" is now replaced by Darius I (Chapter 6), a Persian, who pronounced his name, "Duh-RIGH-us."
- C. With Belshazzar's death (end of Ch. 5) and the ascension of Darius I (Ch.6), we pass from the *gold head* of Nebuchadnezzar's statue to its *silver chest and arms*, with the Medo-Persian Empire. (Babylon is no more!)
- D. This chapter is really about the *two proclamations* by King Darius I.

STUDY SECTION

DANIEL DESPISED • DARIUS DECEIVED (vv. 1-9)

"But Daniel resolved to not defile himself..."

- Daniel 1:8

1. In public, purity should be your goal.

Daniel 6:1–5, NASB95 - ¹ *It seemed good to Darius to appoint 120 satraps [ie., governors, Herodotus said there were only 20 MP Satraps so they had to enlist others to help] over the kingdom, ² and over them three commissioners (of whom Daniel was one), that these satraps might be accountable to them, and that the king might not suffer loss [it was about people—their allegiance and their money]. ³ Then this Daniel began distinguishing himself among the commissioners and satraps because he possessed an extraordinary spirit, and the king planned to appoint him over the entire kingdom. ⁴ Then the commissioners and satraps began trying to find a ground of accusation against Daniel in regard to government affairs; but they could find no ground of accusation or evidence of corruption, inasmuch as he was faithful, [lit., trustworthy (NIV); ie., integrity] and no negligence or corruption was to be found in him. ⁵ Then these men said, "We will not find any ground of accusation against this Daniel unless we find it against him with regard [lit., daring to] to the law of his God."*

A. Stand _____—whatever the situation.

"No negligence or corruption in him." - v. 4

B. Stay _____—whatever your age.

"...he possessed an extraordinary spirit." - v. 3

C. Show _____—whatever the job.

"...he was trustworthy in all things" - v. 3 (JBP)

D. Seek _____—whatever the moment.

"We will not find any ground of accusation against this Daniel unless we [can pit man's law against] the law of His God." - v. 5
