STUDY VERSE SECTION - Psalm 11:1-7, NASB95 – The LORD a Refuge and Defense [not ancient], For the choir director. A Psalm of David (these words are in the original text]. ¹ In the Lord I take refuge [lit., "Lord, in You I take refuge"]! How [a rebuke in the Heb. syntax meaning, "how dare you"] Can you [some entity] Say to my soul, "Flee as a bird to your mountain; ² For, behold, the wicked bend the bow, They make ready their arrow upon the string To shoot in darkness at the upright in heart.³ If the foundations are destroyed, [a Heb. parabolic metaphor for the complete breakdown of law and order in society] What can the righteous do?"⁴ The LORD is in His holy temple; the LORD's throne is in heaven; His eyes behold, His eyelids test the sons of men. ⁵ The LORD tests the righteous and the wicked, And the one who loves violence His soul IThe Heb. word, nep-HESH, rf., the deepest part of mind, body and soul-the entire being] hates [that's not a kind word]. ⁶ Upon the wicked He will rain snares; Fire and brimstone and burning wind will be the portion of their cup. 7 For the Lord is righteous, He loves righteousness; The upright will behold His face [reflects the practice of being admitted into His presence of the King].



1. Remember Who our Commitment is to.

Psalm 11:1, NASB95 - ¹ In the Lord I take refuge....

A. Do not flee.

Psalm 11:1, NASB95 - ¹ ... <u>How can you say to my soul, "Flee</u> as a bird to your mountain;....

B. Do not fear.

Psalm 11:2, NASB95 - ² For, behold, <u>the wicked bend the bow,</u> <u>They make ready their arrow</u> upon the string <u>To shoot in</u> <u>darkness at the upright in heart</u>.

C. Do not fret.

Psalm 11:3, GNB - ³ <u>There is nothing a good person can do</u> when everything falls apart."

For King David, it's not about the <u>what;</u> it's about the <u>Who</u>!

2. Remember Who our Confidence is in.

A. God's Preeminence.

Psalm 11:4, NASB95 - ⁴ <u>The LORD is in His holy temple</u>; the LORD's throne <u>is in heaven</u>....

B. God's Judgement.

Psalm 11:4–5, NLT - ⁴ But the LORD is in his holy Temple; the LORD still rules from heaven. He watches everyone closely, examining every person on earth. ⁵ The LORD examines both the righteous and the wicked. He hates those who love violence.

C. God's Deliverance.

Psalm 11:7, HCSB - ⁷ For the LORD is righteous; He loves righteous deeds. <u>The upright will see His face</u>.

<u>Our security</u> is only found in <u>God's sovereignty</u>!

- His Sovereignty, v. 4 The Lord rules from heaven.
- His Omniscience, v. 5 The Lord examines everyone's deeds.
- His Justice, v. 6 The Lord punishes the wicked.
- His presence, v. 7 The Lord reveals Himself to the righteous.
