A. Job says, "Who am I?"

Job 40:1–5, NLT -¹ Then the LORD said to Job, ² "Do you still want to argue with the Almighty? You are God's critic, but do you have the answers?" ³ Then Job replied to the LORD, ⁴ "I am nothing—how could I ever find the answers? I will cover my mouth with my hand. ⁵ I have said too much already. I have nothing more to say."

I am weak - "I am nothing" (meaning "completely abated").

I am unwise - "How could I ever find the answers."

I am wordy - "I will cover my mouth...I've said too much."

I am unworthy - "I have nothing more to say."

B. God says, "Who am I?"

Job 40:7–14, NCV -⁷ "Be strong, like a man! I will ask you questions, and you must answer me. ⁸ Would you say that I am unfair? <u>Would you blame me to make yourself look right</u>? ⁹ Are you as strong as God? Can your voice thunder like his? ¹⁰ If so, then decorate yourself with glory and beauty; dress in honor and greatness as if they were clothing. ¹¹ Let your great anger punish; look at the proud and bring them down.

¹² Look at the proud and make them humble. Crush the wicked wherever they are. ¹³ Bury them all in the dirt together; cover their faces in the grave. ¹⁴ If you can do that, then I myself will praise you, because you are strong enough to save yourself.

Job 40:8, TLB -8 Are you going to <u>discredit my justice</u> and <u>condemn me so</u> that you can say you are right?

Job 40:8, MSG - 8 "Do you presume to tell me what I'm doing wrong? <u>Are</u> you calling me a sinner so you can be a saint?

- Job, in justifying himself, is condemning God.
- Job has not only been criticizing <u>God's Power</u> ("Can't You do something about this?"), but also <u>His Justice</u> ("Can't You do anything right?").
- Job, in essence, has said, "I could do a better job at being God."

1. God Asked Job Four Questions:

Are my judgements useless? Are you right and am I wrong? Are you as powerful as Me? Is your voice louder than Mine?

2. God says if any of these questions are true, do this:

Put on your majesty and glory. Clothe yourself in splendor and beauty.

Show your great power. Demonstrate your wise justice.

Humble the proud. Judge the wicked. Save yourself.

"Job, if you are more powerful than Me, show it. If you are wiser than Me, say it. And if you can do a better job than Me, do it."

C. God's Mercy is What We Really Need—Not His Justice.

<u>Study Verse Section—Romans 8:28, NASB95</u> - ²⁸ And <u>we</u> [as Christians] <u>know</u> [intuitively and can experience personally] **that** <u>God causes</u> [lit., "harmonizes"] <u>all</u> ie., every single one--all <u>things</u> to <u>work</u> [we get our English word "synergy" from this word] <u>together</u> for good [lit., "the good"] to those who (1) <u>love God</u>, and (2) to those who are <u>called</u> according to <u>His</u> [ie., eternal] <u>purpose</u>.

- 1. There is something **CONFIDENTIAL** about storms. "...we know..."
- 2. There is something **COMPREHENSIVE** about storms. "...all things..."
- **3.** There is something **CONSTRUCTIVE** about storms. "...work...for good"
- **4.** There is something **CONDITIONAL** about storms. "...love God...called."
