A. Job is still in the Whirlwind (review)

Job 38:1–4, NASB95 - ¹ Then the LORD answered Job out of the whirlwind and said, ² "Who is this that darkens counsel By words without knowledge? ³ "Now gird up your loins like a man, And I will ask you, and you instruct Me! ⁴ "Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? Tell Me, if you have understanding…."

Power – Job, like many other Bible characters, caught a glimpse of <u>God's</u> power and sovereignty.

- Isaiah caught sight of God's power in the temple (Isaiah 6).
- Ezekiel saw God's power in a storm cloud during his exile (Ezek. 1).
- John saw the power of God like a storm from a prison island (Rev. 2:4ff).
- When Christ was crucified, a storm arose (Acts 2:23).

Everything has been worked out. Everything has a meaning. Everything is in God's hands, even if we cannot see any purpose in it.

Greatness – God is not only powerful and sovereign; He is also great!

- Isaiah saw God "high and exalted" (Isaiah 6:1).
- Paul said, he didn't know why things were happening, what lay ahead, or how difficult it would be, but he knew WHO he believed in (2 Tim. 1:12).

Holiness – Job observed God's holiness and purity in the storm.

- Job covered himself with ashes when in God's presence.
- In the storm—in front of God—Job realized his sinfulness and God's holiness.
- Job has been confronted by the God whose "... eyes are too pure to look on evil" (Habakkuk 1:13).

Grace – Job has now bowed before God Almighty, before His sheer power as creator, comprehend-er, controller, carer, and soon to be, curer of all things.

• Job would soon feel the extent of God's mercy in his own restoration.

B. Job's Response Before God (42:1-6)

1. Affirmation

Job 42:1–2, NASB95 - ¹ Then Job answered the LORD and said, ² "I know that <u>You can do all things</u>, And that <u>no purpose of Yours can</u> be thwarted.

2. Awe

Job 42:3, NLT - ³ You asked, 'Who is this that questions my wisdom with such ignorance?' It is I—and I was talking about things I knew nothing about, things far too wonderful for me.

3. Attention

Job 42:4, GNB - 4 You told me to listen while you spoke....

4. Adoration

Job 42:5, NIV84 - ⁵ My ears had heard of you but now <u>my eyes</u> have seen you.

5. Apology

Job 42:6, NIV84 - ⁶ Therefore I <u>despise myself and repent</u> in dust and ashes."
