Daniel 1:17, NASB95 - ¹⁷ As for these four youths, <u>God gave them knowledge and intelligence</u> in every branch of literature and wisdom; Daniel even understood all kinds of visions and dreams.

Daniel 1:18–20, NASB95 - ¹⁸ Then at the end of the days which the king had specified for presenting them [i.e., 3 years], the commander of the officials presented them before Nebuchadnezzar. ¹⁹ The king talked with them, [lit., inquired of them, meaning, he examined and compared them] and out of them all not one was found like Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael and Azariah; so they entered the king's personal service. ²⁰ As for every matter of wisdom and understanding about which the king consulted them, he found them ten times better than all the magicians [those that dealt with the occult] and conjurers [those that put spells on people] who were in all his realm.

Daniel 1:21, NASB95 - 21 And Daniel continued until the first year of

Cyrus the king. [The first year of King Cyrus' reign was 539 BC, but Daniel was still alive in 537 BC, the third year of Cyrus (cf., 10:1)—that means Daniel would be nearly 90 years old, if not more—that's quite a run!]
