A. Job Chapters 32-37 (Overview)

Ch. 32 – Elihu speaks to Job and his friends.

Setting: We are at the ash heap where Job, his three friends, and God are all silent. Now, an angry Elihu speaks.

Summary: Job is rebuked for his pride and self-centricity; the three friends are rebuked for their pride and lack of true understanding.

Job 32:2–3, NLT - ² Then <u>Elihu...became angry</u>. <u>He was angry because Job refused to admit that he had sinned</u> and that God was right in punishing him. ³ <u>He was also angry with Job's three friends</u>, for they made God appear to be wrong by their inability to answer Job's arguments.

Ch. 33 - Elihu's First Speech: "God is not silent."

Job 33:13, NCV - ¹³ Why do you accuse God of not answering anyone?... ¹⁶ <u>He speaks in their ears</u> and frightens them with warnings....

God can speak through visions, storm, angels, friends, letters.

He is superior to all others • He is ever communicating with everyone.

Ch. 34 – Elihu's Second Speech: "God is not unjust."

Job 34:10, NCV - ¹⁰ "So listen to me, you who can understand. <u>God</u> can never do wrong! It is impossible for the Almighty to do evil.

Ch. 35 – Elihu's Third Speech: "God is not uncaring."

Job 35:10, NLT - ¹⁰ Yet they <u>don't ask</u>, 'Where is God my Creator, the one who gives songs in the night?



First, in the night of suffering, God is our only song. Second, only God can inspire us to sing "songs in the night." - C.H. Spurgeon, Sermon/Book: Songs of the Night, pp. 21-22)

Ch. 36 - Elihu's Fourth Speech: "God is not powerless."

Job 36:5–6, NLT - ⁵ "<u>God is mighty</u>, but he does not despise anyone! He is mighty in both power and understanding. ⁶ He does not let the wicked live but gives justice to the afflicted.

Ch. 37 – Elihu's Final Speech: "God controls the future."

Job 37:5, NIV84 - ⁵ God's voice thunders in marvelous ways; <u>he</u> does great things beyond our understanding... ¹³ He causes [the <u>future</u>] to happen. ¹⁴ "Listen to this, Job; stop and consider God's wonders.
