## Review from Last Week's Message

## Message Section

### 1. Paul made a conscious \_\_\_\_\_ to be joyful.

**Philippians 1:3–4, NCV** -<sup>3</sup> *I thank my God every time I remember you, always praying with joy for all of you.*

**Philippians 4:4, NASB** -<sup>4</sup> *Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice!*

**For the believer: Joy is a choice!**

**Biblical Joy, accompanied with God's calming presence, is the ability to see spiritual truths and eternal realities in the midst of any situation.**

### 2. Paul put his \_\_\_\_\_ in God alone.

**Philippians 1:6, ESV** -<sup>6</sup> *And I am sure of this, that He who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ.*

### 3. Paul had \_\_\_\_\_ with other believers.

**Philippians 1:7–11, NLT** -<sup>7</sup> *So it is right that I should feel as I do about all of you, for you have a special place in my heart. You share with me the special favor of God, both in my imprisonment and in defending and confirming the truth of the Good News. God knows how much I love you and long for you with the tender compassion of Christ Jesus. <sup>9</sup> I pray that your love will overflow more and more, and that you will keep on growing in knowledge and understanding. <sup>10</sup> For I want you to understand what really matters, so that you may live pure and blameless lives until the day of Christ's return. <sup>11</sup> May you always be filled with the fruit of your salvation—the righteous character produced in your life by Jesus Christ—for this will bring much glory and praise to God.*

## Life Application Section



### Love and Forgiveness must Characterize our Companionship.

Dr. Richard J. Foster, *Prayer: Finding the Heart's True Home*, “So, what does it mean to forgive someone? In its simplest terms, to forgive is to “surrender our right to get even.” Practically, this involves four promises:

- I will no longer dwell on this incident.
- I will not bring up this incident again or use it against you.
- I will not talk to others about this incident.
- I will not allow this incident to stand between us or hinder our relationship.

**Biblically, ‘forgive’ means to ‘give over’ (to God).**

Answers: 1. Choice, 2. Confidence, 3. Companionship.
