A. The Rebuke of the Three Friends (42:7-9)

1. A Flawed Theology

Job 42:7, NLT -⁷ After the LORD had finished speaking to Job, he said to Eliphaz the Temanite: "I am angry with you and your two friends, <u>for</u> you have not spoken accurately about me, as my servant Job has.

Their Flawed Theology Said,

"If you do good things, God will bless you; If you do bad things, God will punish you."

2. A Sacrifice Required for Their Flawed Theology

Job 42:8, NLT -⁸ So take <u>seven bulls and seven rams</u> and <u>go to my</u> <u>servant Job</u> and offer a burnt offering for yourselves. My servant Job will pray for you, and I will accept his prayer on your behalf. I will not treat you as you deserve, for you have not spoken accurately about me, as my servant Job has."

3. A Prayer Needed for Flawed Theology

Job 42:8, NLT - ⁸ ... <u>My servant Job will pray for you, and I will accept</u> <u>his prayer on your behalf</u>. I will not treat you as you deserve, for you have not spoken accurately about me, as my servant Job has." ⁹ So Eliphaz the Temanite, Bildad the Shuhite, and Zophar the Naamathite did as the LORD commanded them, and the LORD accepted Job's prayer.

Job prayed for restoration—not condemnation.

B. A Flawed Theology Corrected

The difficulties we experience as followers of Christ will come from one of seven sources:

- 1. The natural consequences of foolish actions and/or decisions.
- 2. The attacks of Satan on your life.
- 3. The consequences of sin in your life.
- 4. The testing of God designed to cause spiritual growth.
- 5. The consequences of other people's sin our life.
- 6. Just life in general . . . "We live in a fallen world."

7. It may not be about you; it may be all for God's glory (like Job's life).

C. God Will Write the Last Chapter

God reminds Job's friends four times that Job is 'my servant' (42:7-8).

Seven things are highlighted by this reference:

1. Job's saving relationship with God. "My Redeemer lives!" (Job 19:25)

- 2. Job's wisdom. "Spoken of me what is right..." (Job 42:7)
- 3. Our need for a Sacrifice. "Burnt offering..." (Job 42:8)
- 4. The defeat of Satan. "Have you considered my servant Job?" (Job 2:3)
- **5. The coming kingdom of God.** "Well done my good and faithful servant!" (Matthew 25:21)
- 6. The prayers of an intercessor. "The holy spirit... intercedes..." (Rom. 8)
- 7. God is about to make all things right. "The Lord... restored (Job)..."
