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## A. Review of Job (Chapters 1—37)

- 1. "There was a man in the land of Uz whose name was Job..." (Job 1:1a)
- 2. Famed for his suffering, Job really wasn't that patient.
- 3. His life was marked by great faithfulness. (Job 1:1)
- 4. His life was marked by a great family. (Job 1:2)
- 5. His life was marked by a great fortune. (Job 1:3)
- 6. His life was marked by great fame.
- 7. His life was marked by favor. (Job 31:16-32)
- 8. Then, one day Job went from being a hero to a zero.
- 9. No man in the Bible, outside of Jesus, suffered more than Job.
- 10. In one day, Job lost everything! (Job 1:13-17)
- 11. His suffering was activated by a satanic force. (Job 1:6-7)
- 12. We also learned that Satan ALWAYS answers to God.
- 13. The real question is not "Why is there evil" but "Why does God bring good out of evil?" Why does God work for <u>His glory</u> and <u>our good?</u>
- 14. Job did not suffer because he had done something wrong. He suffered in spite of the fact that he was doing everything right.
- 15. Job learned firsthand what it was like when life isn't fair.
- 16. The Bible says, "In all this [Job] did not sin with his lips." (Job 2:10)

- 17. "What God allows; God redeems." Pastor Joe
- 18. Job not only had Satan attacking him, he had four friends attacking him.
- 19. Eliphaz said, "It is because of your sin, Job."
- 20. Zophar said, "It is because of your sin, Job."
- 21. Bildad said, "It is because of your sin, Job."
- 22. Young Elihu said, "It has to be because of your sin, Job."
- 23. <u>Important</u>: Every sin causes suffering, but suffering is not always caused by sin. (Thought: Jesus never sinned—but He did suffer!)
- 24. Job asked God a big question and He was silent for thirty-seven chapters.

# **B. Job's Question and God's Reply**

### 1. The Request of Job.

**Job 7:20, NASB95** - <sup>20</sup> "<u>Have I sinned</u>? What have I done to You, O watcher of men? Why have You set me as Your target, So that I am a burden to myself?

**Job 13:22-23, KJV 1900** - <sup>22</sup> "<u>Answer thou me!</u> How many are my iniquities and sins?

What have I done to deserve this?

How can I be made right with God?

Can God kill me now? • If a man dies, will he live again?

Job 38:1, NASB95 - <sup>1</sup> Then <u>the LORD</u> [all CAPS means יְהְוֶּה (Yahweh) the highest name for creator God] <u>answered Job</u> out of the <u>whirlwind</u> [Heb.קּעָרָה (sar-a-rh), lit., a mighty storm, think Hurricane] and said....

God's answer is always final! • There will be no appeal!

God's answer will display His glorious character and power.
