Read Philippians 3:1-3

2 Look out for the dogs, look out for the evildoers, look out for those who mutilate the flesh. 3 For we are the circumcision, who worship by the Spirit of God and glory in Christ Jesus and put no confidence in the flesh—

4. What was something from the passage or sermon that surprised you, helped you, confused you, or bothered you?

5. What does this passage tell us about God? People? Living to please God?

6. Who are the "dogs", "evildoers," and "those who mutilate the flesh"? How are they contrasted with the Philippians?

7. Why would Paul consider those who held a different gospel to be evil workers? Why would it be evil to teach that the cross and additional behaviors are necessary for salvation?

8. If anything gets added to salvation by grace alone in Christ alone, what does that mean about the sufficiency of Christ? Why is the cross enough for salvation?

9. Paul called us to "rejoice in the Lord." His next thought is to "Look out for the dogs, look out for the evildoers, look out for those who mutilate the flesh." How might the influence of these people keep the Philippians from rejoicing in the Lord?

10. How have you seen Christians point people towards our acceptance with God being "doing good" instead of "glorying in Christ?"

11. Why should we rejoice in the Lord? What are some reasons that we get sidetracked from rejoicing in Christ? Why is rejoicing in the Lord foundational to our faith?

For Extra Study

Read Galatians 5:1-14

For freedom Christ has set us free; stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery.

2 Look: I, Paul, say to you that if you accept circumcision, Christ will be of no advantage to you. 3 I testify again to every man who accepts circumcision that he is obligated to keep the whole law. 4 You are severed from Christ, you who would be justified by the law; you have fallen away from grace. 5 For through the Spirit, by faith, we ourselves eagerly wait for the hope of righteousness. 6 For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision counts for anything, but only faith working through love. 7 You were running well. Who hindered you from obeying the truth? 8 This persuasion is not from him who calls you. 9 A little leaven leavens the whole lump. 10 I have confidence in the Lord that you will take no other view, and the one who is troubling you will bear the penalty, whoever he is. 11 But if I, brothers, still preach circumcision, why am I still being persecuted? In that case the offense of the cross has been removed. 12 I wish those who unsettle you would emasculate themselves!

13 For you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another. 14 For the whole law is fulfilled in one word: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."
