For Extra Study Read 2 Timothy 3:10-17 and use the DBS questions below.

2 Timothy 3:10-17 ESV

10 You, however, have followed my teaching, my conduct, my aim in life, my faith, my patience, my love, my steadfastness, 11 my persecutions and sufferings that happened to me at Antioch, at Iconium, and at Lystra—which persecutions I endured; yet from them all the Lord rescued me. 12 Indeed, all who desire to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted, 13 while evil people and impostors will go on from bad to worse, deceiving and being deceived. 14 But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom[a] you learned it 15 and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. 16 All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, 17 that the man of God[b] may be complete, equipped for every good work.

A. Observation - What do I see?

- What one principle or insight that stands out from the message was particularly helpful, insightful, encouraging, new, or difficult to grasp?

B. Interpretation - What does it mean?

- What does the passage tell us about God?
- What does the passage tell us about People?
- What does the passage tell us about living to please God?
- Is there a command to follow?
- Is there a sin to avoid?
- What does the context tell us about the passage?

Application Questions

C. Application - How does it apply to me?

- What does this passage want me to think and believe about God?
- What does God want me to desire?
- How does this passage change how you view God?
- How does this passage change how you view Yourself?
- How does this passage change how you view Other people?
- How should this passage change how you live?

D. Implementation - What do I do?

- What specifically would you do differently this coming week?
- Who can you tell what you learned?
- How can this group help you do this?
