Paul reminds the Gentiles of who they were...

- They were "separated from Christ."
- They were "alienated from the commonwealth of Israel."

- They were "strangers to the covenants of promise..."
- They had "no hope."
- They were "without God in the world."

- You weren't citizens of God's kingdom.
- You weren't saints, who inherit the promises of God.
- You weren't members of the household of God.
- You didn't have any hope for the future.
- You were without God.

It's through Jesus' blood—being a sacrifice for our sins—that we're reconciled to God...and to one another.

That which once divided us is no longer when in Christ.

Since Jesus is your peace, live as _____ with Christ & one another.

- ...to reconcile you horizontally—in relationship to one another in the church.

and to open its seals,

for you were slain, and by your blood you ransomed people for God from every tribe and language and people and nation,

Revelation 7:9 ESV

9 After this I looked, and behold, a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, with palm branches in their hands,
