

Into the Bible Questions:
Read Philippians 1:3-11
Philippians 1:3-11 – 3 I thank my God in all my remembrance of you, 4 always in every prayer of mine for you all making my prayer with joy, 5 because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now. 6 And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ. 7 It is right for me to feel this way about you all, because I hold you in my heart, for you are all partakers with me of grace, both in my imprisonment and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel. 8 For God is my witness, how I yearn for you all with the affection of Christ Jesus. 9 And it is my prayer that your love may abound more and more, with knowledge and all discernment, 10 so that you may approve what is excellent, and so be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, 11 filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ, to the glory and praise of God.

For Extra Study: Read 1 Peter 5:5-10
1 Peter $5:5-10-5$ Likewise, you who are younger, be subject to the elders. Clothe yourselves, all of you, with humility toward one another, for "God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble."
6 Humble yourselves, therefore, under the mighty hand of God so that at the proper time he may exalt you, 7 casting all your anxieties on him, because he cares for you. 8 Be soberminded; be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour. 9 Resist him, firm in your faith, knowing that the same kinds of suffering are being experienced by your brotherhood throughout the world. 10 And after you have suffered a little while, the God of all grace, who has called you to his eternal glory in Christ, will himself restore, confirm, strengthen, and establish you.

3. What needs to change in your life so that you can live this out?
4. Jot down any insights, questions, or key observations.

## **Application Questions**

1. Think of the Christians that know you best. What in your life would cause them to thank God, rejoice, and have confidence that God is at work in your life?
2. If Paul's prayer was answered in your life, how might your perspective on suffering for the gospel be transformed? How would your personal life or ministry be impacted?
3. What about your community group members' lives cause you to give thanks, rejoice over and have confidence for them? Take some time to share.
4. What would it take to be able to say about each other, "We are partners in the gospel"?
5. What are some ways you can grow in Knowledge and Discernment so you can abound in God's true love?
