- 2. In what ways can new believers share their faith even before they know much about the Bible?

- 4. When was the last time you shared honestly, "I don't know the answer, but I can find out"? How could that honesty itself point someone to Jesus?

2. It's Biblical (1 Peter 3:15)

3. It's Intentional and Relational (Matthew 9:9)

- 1. Why is intentionality and relationship so important in disciple-making compared to just posting messages online?
- 2. Looking at Matthew 9:9, what stands out about Jesus' approach to calling Matthew to follow Him?
- 3. How have you seen someone's ordinary faithfulness influence others in powerful ways?

Application Questions

- 4. Who in your circle of influence might be open to spiritual conversations if you were more intentional?
- 5. What's one relational investment (a coffee, a walk, a text) you can make this week to build a bridge for the gospel?

4. It's All-Encompassing (1 Corinthians 10:31; John 10:10)

1 Corinthians 10:31 - So, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God

- 1. How do we often separate our lives into "spiritual" and "secular" categories? Why is that a problem?
- 2. What does 1 Corinthians 10:31 teach us about representing Christ in every area of life?

Application Questions

- 3. Think about your daily routines (meals, commuting, errands). How could you invite Jesus into those moments to represent Him?
- 4. Is there an area of your life where you still keep things "secular" instead of surrendering them to Jesus' lordship? What step could you take to change that?

5. It's a Life-Long Pursuit (John 21:22; Philippians 1:6)

John 21:22 - Jesus said to him, "If it is my will that he remain until I come, what is that to you? You follow me!"

Philippians 1:6 - And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ.

- 1. Why do you think following Jesus is described as a "life-long pursuit" rather than a one-time decision?
- 2. How does Philippians 1:6 encourage you when you feel like your spiritual growth is too slow?
- 3. Why do you think growing in your awareness of your need for Jesus is actually a sign of maturity?

Application Questions

- 4. What's one practical way you can grow in your dependence on Jesus this month?
- 5. What habit could you start (or restart) that would remind you daily that following Jesus is a lifelong pursuit?
