Discussion Questions – April 14, 2024 – Stories of Redemption

Getting to know you Questions:

- 1. Have you ever been trapped in a room, pit, or difficult space? What was it? How did that make you feel? How did you try to get out?
- 2. Hopelessness is a very dangerous attitude. Do you agree with this statement? Why or why not?

Into the Bible Questions:

Psalm 130

- 9. When you "wait" on God to redeem you, what do you normally do?
- 10. How would hoping in God and his steadfast love help you deal with your sin?

Read the following passage: 1 Peter 1:17-19

17 And if you call on him as Father who judges impartially according to each one's deeds, conduct yourselves with fear throughout the time of your exile, 18 knowing that you were ransomed from the futile ways inherited from your forefathers, not with perishable things such as silver or gold, 19 but with the precious blood of Christ, like that of a lamb without blemish or spot.
