"Behold, your house is left to you desolate." (Matthew 23)

• The Old Testament Prophetic Lawsuit Pattern

"All that the Lord has spoken, we will do" (Ex. 24:7)

"Hear, O heavens, and give ear, O earth, for the Lord has spoken" (Isa. 1:2)

Every prophetic book has this pattern: **indictment, warning, call to repentance,** and sentence.

• Matthew 23 – The Seven Woes and the Desolation of the Temple

"Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites!" (Matt. 23:29)

"So that on you may come all the righteous blood shed on earth... Truly, I say to you, all these things will come upon this generation" (Matt. 23:35–36)

"O Jerusalem, Jerusalem... How often would I have gathered your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing! Behold, your house is left to you desolate" (Matt. 23:37–38)

• Revelation's Babylon Imagery and Prophetic Bloodguilt

"In her was found the blood of prophets and of saints, and of all who have been slain on earth" (Rev. 18:24)

• Why This Matters for Understanding the Fall of Jerusalem
