- 6. According to **Luke 1:4**, what was the <u>ultimate purpose</u> of the Gospel of Luke and how might examining these claims impact one who is already a follower of Jesus compared to one who is not yet a follower of Jesus?
- 7. Share something you are thankful for, a need you have, then lift one another to the Father in prayer.
