SHOW UP.

It is vital that you stay involved in the life of the church. The letter to the Hebrews addressed some who were inconsistent with meeting with their faith family.

Hebrews 10:24-25 (NIV)

And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, **not giving up meeting together**, <u>as some are in the habit of doing</u>, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

If you SHOW UP regularly to our Worship Gathering, keep it up! But don't stop with that. Church is <u>not</u> to be a place or event, but a FAITH FAMILY we do life with.

X The Christian who refuses to obey all the "one anothers" is disobeying 50% of what God commands.

Hebrews 10:24-25 commands followers of Jesus to "**spur one another on toward love and good deeds**" and to **encourage one another** as we get closer and closer to the return of Jesus.

- ② Does that sound like your relationship with people in your local church?
- ✓ SHOW UP and make meeting with your Church a priority over everything else.

QUESTIONS:

- (?) If everybody was a committed to the local church as I am, would MY church look more like a CLUB or a FAMILY?
- If my kids, grandkids, or friends follow my example, will they follow the commands of Jesus to meet together consistently, challenge other Christians to love and good deeds, and encourage other believers to remain faithful to Jesus & one another?

Many in the 1st century who claimed Christ weren't growing like they needed to.

1 Corinthians 3:1-2 (NIV)

Brothers and sisters, I could not address you as people who live by the Spirit but as <u>people who are still worldly</u>—mere **infants** in Christ. I gave you milk, not solid food, for you were not yet ready for it. Indeed, **you are still not ready**.

Does that sound like people who are seeking first the KING and the KINGdom? NOPE. They were **worldly** instead of Godly. They were much weaker than they should have been at this stage. The author of Hebrews was concerned about the same thing with the people he was writing to.

Hebrews 5:12-14 (NIV)

In fact, though <u>by this time you ought to be teachers</u>, you need someone to teach you the elementary truths of God's word all over again. You need milk, not solid food! Anyone who lives on milk, being **still an infant**, is not acquainted with the teaching about righteousness. But <u>solid food is for the mature</u>, **who by constant use have trained themselves to distinguish good from evil**.

These people were satisfied being spiritual babies, depending on other people to feed them with no desire to grow so they could help others grow. Even though they were *SHOWING UP*, they <u>weren't</u> *GROWING UP*.

? Are YOU doing to GROW UP in Jesus? How are you training to distinguish good from evil?

3 Options to determine who God is and what God says:

- 1. **Make it up**. Many people make up their version of God and what He expects.
- 2. Listen to what others say about the Scriptures, but how can you determine if what they teach is true?
- 3. Read the Scriptures for yourself and help teach others.
 - Is your goal to check off a task...OR...is your goal to get to know your God and GROW in Him?

Develop a plan

- Find a quiet place
- Make an appointment time
- Read from an understandable translation of the Bible.
- Follow a reading plan (1 chapter a day or *M'Cheyne Bible Reading Plan* 4 chapters a day from 4 different passages from the Scriptures¹). Pick up a copy today at the front entrance.
- Have writing tools ready (highlighter, pen & paper, or digital device).

Prioritize your appointment.

- Go to bed on time (early enough to wake up early enough).
- Set an alarm to be on time.
- Ditch the Distractions (Turn off notifications social accounts, emails, etc.)

PRAY.

- Ask God to speak through the Scripture.
- Write down your THANKS and REQUESTS.

Read it right.

- Read the Scriptures in context (never read A Bible verse)
- Recognize the difference between **descriptive** and **prescriptive**. Does is <u>describe what they DID do</u>, or does it <u>prescribe what we SHOULD do</u>?
- Appreciate what the Scriptures describe & **Practice** what the Scriptures prescribe.

TAKE NOTES.

- Write down insights and questions. You are much more likely to remember what you read when you write it down.
- **Share insights and questions**. This is one of the ways that Christians can have spiritual conversations leading to good questions, deeper study, and sharing what God has used to challenge or encourage you!
