Luke 8:22-25

Psalm 13:1-6 * All passages NIV

¹ How long, LORD? Will you forget me forever? How long will you hide your face from me? ² How long must I wrestle with my thoughts and day after day have sorrow in my heart? How long will my enemy triumph over me? ³ Look on me and answer, LORD my God. Give light to my eyes, or I will sleep in death, ⁴ and my enemy will say, "I have overcome him," and my foes will rejoice when I fall. ⁵ But I trust in your unfailing love; my heart rejoices in your salvation. ⁶ I will sing the LORD's praise, for he has been good to me.

²² One day Jesus said to his disciples, "Let us go over to the other side of the lake." So they got into a boat and set out. ²³ As they sailed, he fell asleep. A squall came down on the lake, so that the boat was being swamped, and they were in great danger. ²⁴ The disciples went and woke him, saying, "Master, Master, we're going to drown!" He got up and rebuked the wind and the raging waters; the storm subsided, and all was calm. ²⁵ "Where is your faith?" he asked his disciples. In fear and amazement they asked one another, "Who is this? He commands even the winds and the water, and they obey him."

- 1. Read Psalm 13:1-6.** Do you ever feel like David did and how does this passage encourage you? Explain your answer.
- 2. Read Luke 8:22-25.** What role does this short passage play in Luke's Gospel? What question does it challenge readers to answer?
- 3. BIG TRUTH: HOW you Trust depends on WHO you Trust.** Name some of the experiences that led the apostles to trust Jesus...even when things got tough (e.g. Acts 5:41)?
4. Share about a difficult time in your life or in another's life that challenged the person to answer, 'Where is your faith?' Why is it that tough times are often the moments that refine us best?
5. What does God want YOU to do with what we studied today?
