

12: DOING IT WRONG? (Matthew 6:1-8,16-18)

Have you ever done the *RIGHT* thing...for the *WRONG* reason? Today we discover why the *attitude* behind the *action* matters.

Doing It Wrong?

Good Works

Matthew 6:1-2 (NIV)

Be careful **not to practice your righteousness in front of others** <u>to be seen by them</u>. If you do, you will have **no reward from your Father in heaven**. So **when you give to the needy**, <u>do not announce it</u> with trumpets, <u>as the hypocrites do</u> in the synagogues and on the streets, <u>to be honored by others</u>. Truly I tell you, **they have received their reward in full**.

Your **reward** from God is forfeited when you do *the right thing <u>for the wrong reason</u>*, **to be seen by** people. Jesus expects His followers to **give to the needy**, *but NOT for the wrong reasons*, **to be honored by others**. Do not announce it with trumpets is a humorous hyperbole. Jesus calls these people **hypocrites** - *people who are pretending to be something or be someone they aren't* (Greek term used of actors who played multiple roles by putting on multiple masks). Jesus says **they have received their reward in full** - *the applause of people* - and that's where there reward ends.

√ The one who wants God to reward them won't parade it on the streets or post it on social media.

Giving to Others with Humility, Love, and Sincerity

Matthew 6:3-4 (NIV)

But **when you give to the needy**, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so that <u>your giving may be in secret</u>. Then **your Father**, <u>who sees what is done in secret</u>, **will reward you**.

The **left hand/right hand** language is a hyperbole, an exaggeration to make a point. What's the point?

- **Kent Hughes** "The idea is, not only are we not to tell others of our giving—we are not to make a big deal of it to ourselves." 1
- ✓ It's then that your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you.

Jesus calls God your Father - your Creator, Provider, & Protector - the One who sees all you do and will reward you!

During the same sermon lesus had said these words:

<u>Matthew 5:16</u> (NIV) In the same way, **let your light shine before others**, <u>that they may see your good deeds</u> and **glorify your Father in heaven**.

• It's not whether what we do HAS BEEN SEEN by others, but whether what we do is done TO BE SEEN by others.

The goal of good works is to honor our Father.

✓ Our good works done in public are to demonstrate *humility*, *love*, and *sincerity*.

X If we are doing it TO BE SEEN by others, then we're doing it wrong.

<u>BIG QUESTION</u>: Do I seek the approval of God or the applause of people?

Prayer

Matthew 6:5-8 (NIV)

And **when you pray**, do not be like <u>the hypocrites</u>, for <u>they love to pray</u> standing in the synagogues and on the street corners <u>to be seen by others</u>. Truly I tell you, <u>they have received their reward in full</u>. But **when you pray**, go into your room, close the door and pray to your Father, who is unseen. Then **your Father**, who sees what is done in secret, **will reward you**. And **when you pray**, <u>do not keep on babbling like pagans</u>, for they think they will be heard because of their <u>many words</u>. Do not be like them, for **your Father knows what you need before you ask Him**.

We see <u>the point of the hypocrite's prayer</u>: **to be seen by others**. Jesus again says that's *ALL* the **reward** they will get - *the applause of people*, but <u>not the approval of the Father</u>.

• Jesus is NOT saying we can never pray in public. How do we know this? **The early church, led by the apostles of Jesus, prayed**<u>in public</u>. The difference? They were praying <u>seeking the approval of God</u> rather than the applause of people.

Jesus was not condemning public prayer, but prayer for the public. Remember WHO you are praying to.

- X You don't get God's attention because of your many words or a formula you follow.
- ✓ God hears you because of the Father He is. Your Father knows what you need, so just ask!
- You might be quick to lead prayer in public, but do you spend time praying in private?

<u>BIG QUESTION</u>: Do I seek the approval of God or the applause of people?

Fasting

Matthew 6:16-18 (NIV)

When you fast, do not look somber as the hypocrites do, for they disfigure their faces to show others they are fasting. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward in full. But when you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face, so that it will not be obvious to others that you are fasting, but only to your Father, who is unseen; and your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you.

Fasting is sacrificing time to eat *in order to pray*; going without food in order to seek God's Presence & God's answers. In fact, while fasting is <u>not commanded</u> it seems to be *expected*. **Do you have something serious to pray about?** Consider taking the time you would eat and spend it instead, spend it in prayer.

But when you fast, it should not be obvious to others. If it is, then the applause of other people is all the reward you will receive.

If you really want God to respond, keep your fast a secret. "And your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you."

- God knows your needs. God knows your sincerity. Your Father will reward you by answering your prayer.
- God will also reward you on the day you go to Him or the day He comes to you. Unless...He is not your Father.

Once again, we need to answer THIS question:

<u>BIG QUESTION</u>: Do I seek the approval of God or the applause of people?



FEET TO FAITH

- **✓** <u>Turn from sin and to Jesus</u> and be adopted by the Father.
- ✓ Find a guiet place and talk to your Father. Thank Him & ask Him for what you need.
- **✓** Ask for opportunities to serve others for the glory of the Father.

discussion questions
