16: Living By Faith - part 2 (Heb 11:7-16)

Living by faith implies that we must do something most of us don't want to do... WAIT - pushing away from temporary satisfaction of sin, in favor of waiting for the eternal benefits of obeying our Savior as modeled by the ancient Hebrew heroes of the faith.

CATCH THE CONTEXT

Last week we opened up Hebrews 11, "The Faith Hall of Fame" - full of faithful characters. The kind of faith God expects is defined in this way.

<u>Hebrews 11:1-2</u> (CSB) Now faith is <u>the reality of what is hoped for</u>, <u>the proof of what is not seen</u>. For **by this our ancestors were approved**.

Hebrews 11:1 (NET) Now **faith** is being sure of what we hope for, being convinced of what we do not see. It is by this kind of faith that the Hebrew ancestors were approved and modeled for others like us to follow.

BIG TRUTH: Genuine faith is living like God exists and God rewards [those who seek Him] (v6)

NOAH'S FAITH

<u>Hebrews 11:7</u> By faith Noah, after he was warned about what was not yet seen and motivated by godly fear, built an ark to deliver his family. By faith he condemned the world and became an heir of the righteousness that comes by faith.

Noah warned about something he had not yet seen - a great flood. By faith (trusting God) Noah built an ark that saved his family.

Like Enoch, Noah walked with God (<u>Gen 6:9</u>), living like God exists and God rewards those who seek Him. But others on the earth were corrupt in God's sight (<u>Gen 6:11</u>), so the Creator decided to start over, to reboot life on earth with Noah, his family, and the animals God would bring to him.

God shares His plan and gives Noah the blueprint for building the ark - 450 feet long, 75 feet wide, and 45 feet high - with 3 decks (1.5 football fields long, and half it's width). Noah and his family begin the massive task which would have taken many years (the Scripture doesn't tell us how long).

Noah must have warned others of what was coming, and probably faced ridicule and persecution for it, since no one besides his family joined them. While others went on like judgement was never coming, Noah and family were preparing and, by faith, trusting God for the yet unseen flood.

Noah lived **by faith** - trusting what God said, while the world around him refused to respond to God's warnings. So while the rest of mankind faced the judgement of God, Noah and his family were saved through the judgement ...all because they had **genuine faith** - **living like God exists and God rewards those who seek Him**.

TAKE SOME NOTES HERE!

Father Abraham's Faith

<u>Hebrews 11:8-10</u> By faith Abraham, when he was called, **obeyed** and set out for a place that he was going to receive as an inheritance. He went out, even though he did not know where he was going. By faith he stayed as a foreigner in the land of promise, <u>living in tents</u> as did Isaac and Jacob, coheirs of the same promise. For he was looking forward to the city that has foundations, whose architect and builder is God.

Would YOU leave your family and friends just because God told you to...without any details? God promised to bless Abraham by giving him a family that would bless all people on the earth (Gen 12:1-3).

Leaving his home and friends, Abraham went to a place to live among people he did <u>not</u> know. Instead of building a huge home and settling down, he and his family continued **living in tents**, as if they were just on a journey <u>rather than making this their home</u>. Why was he willing to do that? Abraham was living to see **the city** that was built by **God**. He was looking forward to an *ETERNAL HOME* rather than just an *EARTHLY HOME*. **Abraham lived BY FAITH** - <u>sure of what he hoped for</u>, and <u>convinced of what he did not yet see</u>.

Abraham had Genuine faith - living like God exists and God rewards those who seek Him.

?) Is that TRUE of YOU?

While we live in this world, do we really recognize that this world is NOT our home? Do we long for the new creation (no sin, sickness, or death...) WITH the God who exists - the One we know will reward us with eternal life?

Sarah's Faith

<u>Hebrews 11:11–12</u> By faith even Sarah herself, when she was unable to have children, received power to conceive offspring, even though she was past the age, since <u>she considered that the One who had promised was faithful</u>. Therefore, from one man—in fact, from one as good as dead—came offspring as numerous as the stars of the sky and as innumerable as the grains of sand along the seashore.

God had years earlier promised to *multiply His family like the stars of the sky* (Gen 15:5), but it was years later before that occurred. 3 strangers come to talk with Abraham (1 is Yahweh in skin).

<u>Genesis 18:9–12</u> "Where is your wife Sarah?" they asked him. "There, in the tent," he answered. The LORD said, "I will certainly come back to you in about a year's time, and **your wife Sarah will have a son!**" Now <u>Sarah was listening at the entrance of the tent behind him</u>. Abraham and Sarah were old and getting on in years. <u>Sarah had passed the age of childbearing</u>. So <u>she laughed to herself</u>: "After I am worn out and my lord is old, will I have delight?"

The Scriptures tell us Abraham was 100 and Sarah was 90 years old (Gn 17:17) at this point! This elderly woman who couldn't have children her whole life is quietly chuckling about the possibility of such an incredible promise.

<u>Genesis 18:13–15</u> But the LORD asked Abraham, "Why did Sarah laugh, saying, 'Can I really have a baby when I'm old?' <u>Is anything impossible for the LORD?</u> At the appointed time I will come back to you, and **in about a year she will have a son**." <u>Sarah denied it</u>. "I did not laugh," she said, because she was afraid. But he replied, "No, <u>you did laugh</u>."

In a piece of divine poetry, God had the last LAUGH, specifying that the boy would be named "Isaac" - meaning "he laughs". When Isaac was born, here's how Sarah responded:

<u>Genesis 22:6-7</u> Sarah said, "God has made me laugh, and <u>everyone who hears will laugh with me</u>." She also said, "Who would have told Abraham that Sarah would nurse children? Yet I have borne a son for him in his old age."

<u>Sarah's laughter later turned to wonder and excitement</u> as she *PUT FAITH IN* **the One** who was **faithful** to fulfill His promise - Who did give them them Isaac, through whom the Hebrew people, and the Hebrew Messiah, would come.

These Hebrew Heroes lived by Faith, living like: 1) God exists and 2) God rewards those who seek Him.

<u>Hebrews 11:13</u> These all **died in faith**, although they had not received the things that were promised. But **they saw them from a distance**, greeted them, and confessed that they were foreigners and <u>temporary residents on the earth</u>.

God was gracious to fulfill many of His promises during the life of Abraham and Sarah, but there were some promises that would not be fulfilled until AFTER they died.

- They didn't get to see this Promised Land become their own still foreigners living in tents, in the land promised them.
- They didn't get to see their family become a mighty nation, beyond some grandkids and great-grandkids.

<u>Hebrews 11:14-16</u> Now those who say such things make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. If they were thinking about where they came from, they would have had an opportunity to return. But **they now desire a better place—a heavenly one**. Therefore, God is not ashamed to be called their God, for <u>He has prepared a city for them</u>.

Just like us, these Hebrew heroes had not SEEN this heavenly place that God had prepared for them...but they TRUSTED GOD...they LIVED BY FAITH...they were sure of what he hoped for, and convinced of what they did not yet see.

They were willing to wait...

...living like God exists and God rewards [those who seek Him

So until we see our God and the place He prepares for us...we will patiently wait and passionately obey what He has told us to do.
