Luke 4:1-13

Luke 4:1-2a * all passages are NIV

¹ Jesus, **full of the Holy Spirit**, left the Jordan and was <u>led by the Spirit into the wilderness</u>, ² where for forty days he was tempted by the devil.

* see Ex. 34:28 (Moses) & 1 Kings 19:8 (Elijah)



Hebrews 2:14-17

¹⁴ Since the children have flesh and blood, **he too shared in their humanity** so that by his death he might break the power of him who holds the power of death—that is, the devil—¹⁵ and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by their fear of death. ¹⁶ For surely it is not angels he helps, but Abraham's descendants. ¹⁷ For this reason **he had to be made like them, fully human in every way**, in order that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in service to God, and that he might make atonement for the sins of the people.

Temptation #1: Doubt God's Love & Satisfy Yourself

Luke 4:2b-4 (NIV)

²He ate nothing during those days, and at the end of them **he was hungry**. ³ The devil said to him, "If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to become bread." ⁴ Jesus answered, "**It is written**: 'Man shall not live on bread alone.'"



Temptation #2: Pursue the Crown. Bypass the Cross.

Luke 4:5-8 (NIV)

⁵ The devil led him up to a high place and showed him in an instant all the kingdoms of the world. ⁶ And he said to him, "I will give you all their authority and splendor; it has been given to me, and I can give it to anyone I want to. ⁷ If you worship me, it will all be yours." ⁸ Jesus answered, "It is written: 'Worship the Lord your God and serve him only.'"

Temptation #3: Twist the intention of Scripture.

Luke 4:9-14

- ⁹ The devil led him to Jerusalem and had him stand on the highest point of the temple.
- "If you are the Son of God," he said, "throw yourself down from here. ¹⁰ For it is written: " 'He will command his angels concerning you to guard you carefully; ¹¹ they will lift you up in their hands, so that you will not strike your foot against a stone.'" (see Ps. 91:11-12)

Hebrews 2:18 (see context of Heb. 2:14-18)

¹⁶ Because he himself suffered when he was tempted, he is able to help those who are being tempted.
