Joshua gives his final words to the people (Josh 23-24). He calls them to be faithful.

✓ JUDGES

Joshua dies "And the people did what was evil in the sight of the LORD and served the Baals" (Jud 2:11).

There is a cycle of sin, oppression, repentance, deliverance, and peace

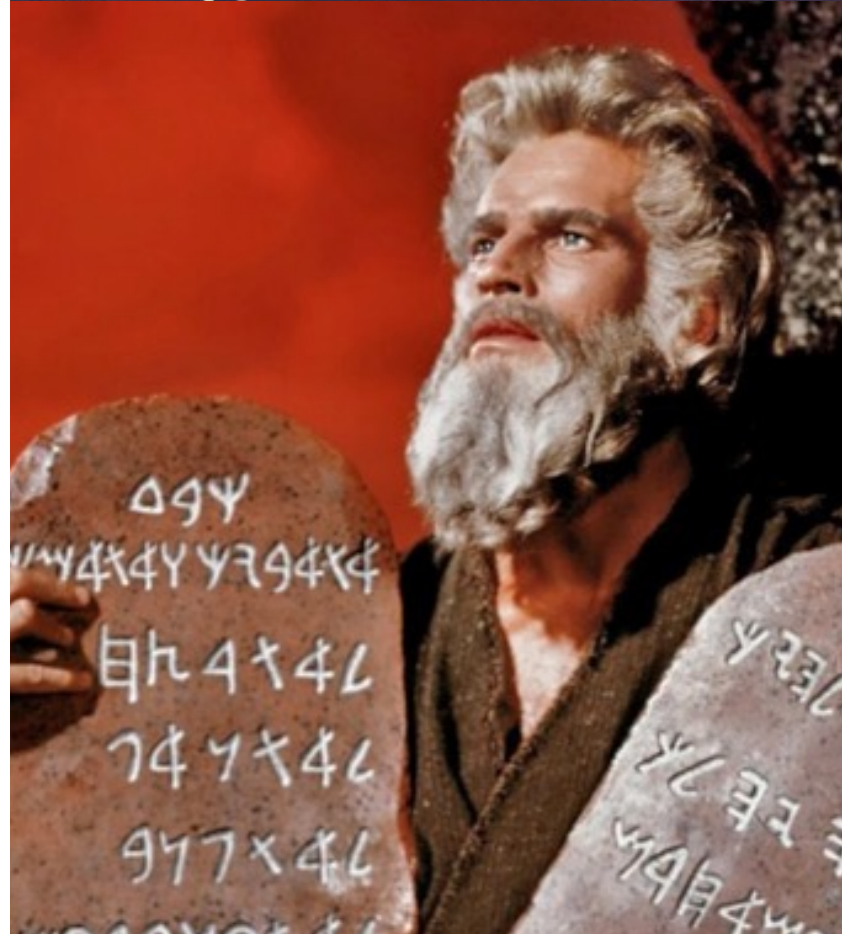
6 main judges = Othniel, Ehud, Deborah, Gideon, Jephthah, Samson

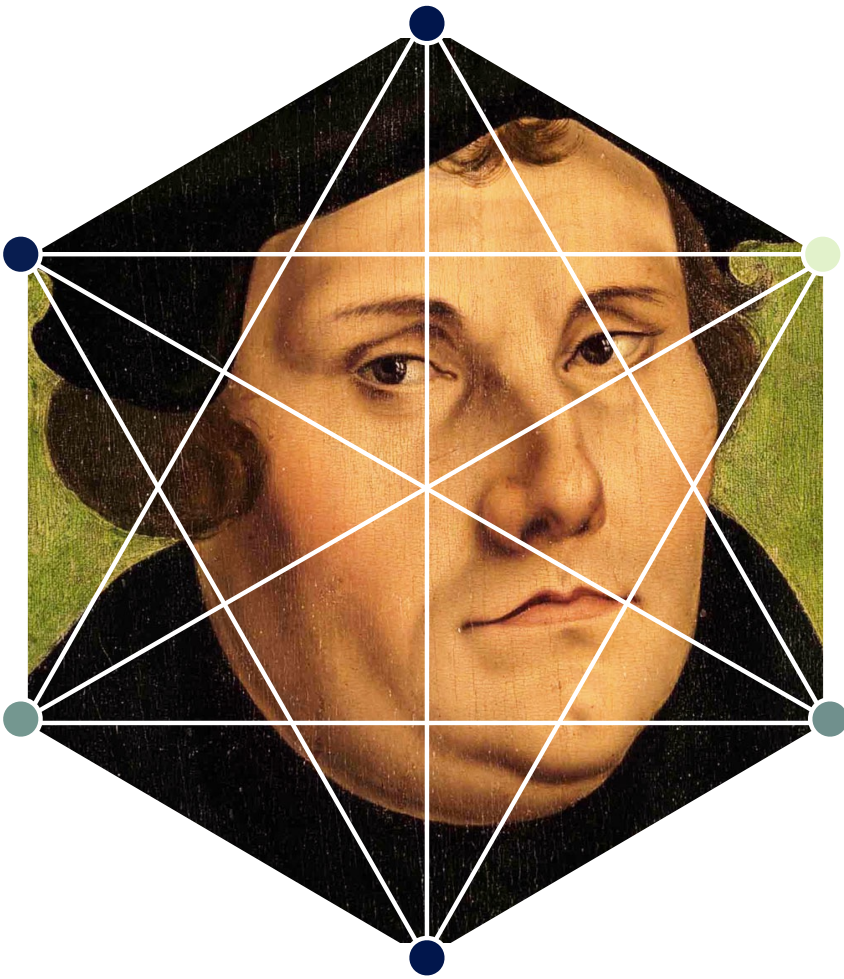
"Israel had no king and everyone did what was right in his own eyes" (Jud 17:6)
