¹³ For the Lord's sake, submit to all human authority—whether the king as head of state, ¹⁴ or the officials he has appointed.

Romans 13:1-7; 1 Timothy 2:1-2

God puts political leaders in office, and they are worthy of our respect and honor, but not of our ultimate allegiance and worship.

Acts 5:17-33

It is possible to submit to the institutions and still disobey the laws.

^{14b} For the king has sent them to punish those who do wrong and to honor those who do right.

Peter did not criticize the Roman government or suggest that it be overthrown. God's church has been able to live and grow in all kinds of political systems.

¹⁵ It is God's will that your honorable lives should silence those ignorant people who make foolish accusations against you.

¹⁶ For you are free, yet you are God's slaves, so don't use your freedom as an excuse to do evil.

Freedom in Christ and citizenship in the kingdom of God in no way permit believers to abuse or disregard the standards of conduct God has established for them on earth.

¹⁷ Respect everyone, and love the family of believers. Fear God, and respect the king.

5. In what ways can we be good citizens in our own culture without violating the will of God?
6. What are some situations where we must obey God rather than people?
